Rene enlightened the BAGS audience on her discovery and journey to write her book, "Wings and a Ring". Rene has met with survivors of the 345th Bomb Group at reunions. She showed an 11 minute newsreel style film of the 345th at the end of the war. Everyone enjoyed her presentation.
