The department sought help from genealogist to assist them. They contacted local genealogist, Nick Cimino and Shera LaPoint from Louisiana.

Shera LaPoint, shared with the group how the genealogist assisted the police department using genealogy to help with the family trees that were being built and researching potential family members through various databases to help identify Jane Doe, now known as Donna Gonsoulin Prudhomme and Janet Doe, now known as Audrey Lee Cook.

Officer Tisdale made a presentation to both Nick Cimino and Shera LaPoint for their assistance with the case. Each were presented with a letter of appreciation from Gary D. Ratliff, Chief of Police and the League City Police Department Chief's Coin of Excellence for Outstanding Performance.
