Tonight's Program – Susie Ganch, 2nd Vice-President, introduced Sharon Batiste Gillins who presented "Navigating the Freedmen's Bureau Records". Ms. Gillins is a native of Galveston, Texas, with paternal ancestral roots in St. Mary Parish, Louisiana, and maternal roots in Fort Bend County, Texas. A life-long interest in her family's history led to an active involvement in genealogical research for more than 25 years. Her research and teaching emphasize strategies and underutilized record sources that can be used to discover details of Southern life and ancestry during the 19th Century including that of planter slave owners, enslaved people, and free people of color. At present, Ms. Gillins is a Research Associate at the Mary Moody Northern Endowment in Galveston, Texas, where she is responsible for the Moody Archive consisting of family and business manuscripts and photographs that date to the early 1800s.
