Library Access Via The Internet

At our October meeting, we learned of the on-line databases which we could access at home via the Internet through Houston Public Library. One of these was "World Catalog" which can be used to locate hard-to-find resources. The Houston Public Library is a wonderful resource; however, don't neglect to check out other library systems that might be available to you. Like the Houston system, many other public

library systems have the same or similar on-line databases available. For example, the Harris County Public Library System has many databases, including "World Catalog." To use the Harris County databases, you need a library card number and a PIN number. One big plus with Harris County is that it is not necessary to reconfigure your browser to use the databases, which can be confusing with the Houston Public Library databases.

Besides databases, many libraries offer on-line services such as catalog search, book renewal, placing holds, viewing your account, reference information, etc.

For those of you who were at the November General Meeting, we heard an interesting and informative talk by Mark Lambert, Special Collections and Government Documents Librarian at the Fred Parks Law Library, South Texas College of Law, in downtown Houston. Mr. Lambert also provided some handouts to help inform us and supply our preservation needs. I am sure we would all like to thank him for taking the time to address our meeting.

While I listened to his talk it brought back echoes from a job I held with the Arizona Historical Society while I was in college. I could hear the archivist, my former boss, saying, "Linda, I hope you don't use pens to write on your pictures at home." "Of course not, David. At least I sure won't from now on." Oops, what was I doing to the kids' pictures last week before I mailed them out to Grandma? I am sure other attendees started making plans to rescue old Bibles and pictures from ziplock bags, and to get those boxes of priceless heirlooms off the top shelf of the closet.

But who is this man we were listening to?
Before moving to Texas in 1988, Mr. Lambert
was born in Ohio and grew up in Massachusetts.
He is a military veteran of the United States
Marine Corps and the Texas Army National
Guard.

The talk on preservation was based on an education which Mr. Lambert received in Texas. He holds a Bachelors and Masters degree in American History from Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas. He also holds a second Masters Degree in Library and Information Science from UT Austin with a specialization in Archives and Records.

Before being employed by the Fred Parks
Law Library, Mr. Lambert was the Archivist
at the San Jacinto Museum of History in La
Porte, Texas. He has received other archival
experience through work at the following
locations: UT Law School Archives in
Austin; Senator John G. Tower Archives,
Southwestern University in Georgetown,
Texas; Episcopal Church USA Archives in
Austin; Museum of Fine Arts Archives in
Houston; and volunteer work at the Texas
State Archives in Austin.

Looking for genealogy information in Harris County? Try using the online searchable database for the Honorable Beverly B. Kaufman, County Clerk for Harris County. The URL to take you directly to the index of databases is:

http://63.101.65.71/CoolICE/RealProperty/mastermenu. If you've never used the databases, the fine people at the County Clerk's office ask that you read the Disclaimer and Overview first.

The following is a list of index record types available on the system. Images of original documents are not available online at this time.

Real Property - January 1961 to present.

Assumed Names - January 1978 to present.

Uniform Commercial Code - January 1983 to present.

Marriage Licenses - February 1961 to present.

Informal Marriage Licenses - January 1970 to present.

County Civil Court At Law Dockets - January 1977 to present.

Probate Court Dockets - November 1837 to present.

Miscellaneous Personal Records - May 1962 to present.

Vital Statistics - June 1879 to present.

County Civil Settings Inquiry

Users with Netscape Navigator may get unpredictable results with searching the database. It is recommended that Microsoft Internet Explorer be used.


