The National Park Service of the U.S. government has released an online index to the military services of the Civil War. The Civil War Soldiers and Sailors System (CWSS) can help you discover if your ancestor served in either the Union or Confederate armed forces. For the individual, the searches provide fields for last name, first name, Union or Confederate, State (or Origin), Unit Number, and Function (infantry, artillery, etc.) The Internet address is

This information may help you if you decide to order military or pension records from the National Archives (NARA). Remember, Confederate pension records are in the respective state archives, not NARA.

Reference Guides to Newspapers

In the first part of my article on finding genealogical records from newspapers in last month's issue of the BAGS Newsletter, I gave you some general information about using reference guides. This month, we'll be looking at some details to help you find those elusive sources.

Recall that I used a book at Clayton Library to locate historical New Jersey newspapers (Directory of New Jersey newspapers, 1765-1970 / [edited by] William C. Wright, Paul A. Stellhorn. Clayton Library Call number: 974.9 D598 NJ). Here is an excerpt from that book in the section on the city of Dover, New Jersey DOVER ADVANCE sw/trw
NjD (pm) Mar 9, 1903-Mar 12, 1906; Mar 10,

1930-May1965 NjMoCoC (nm) Jan 2, 1912-May21, 1914; Jan 8, 1923-Dec 31, 1953:

I referred to the "abbreviations and locations section" to find that "sw" - means published semiweekly. "trw" meant the paper was later published three times a week. The NjD and NjMoCoC are abbreviations of locations where we may be able to access copies of the newspaper. In this example "NjD" is the Dover (City) Free Public Library and "NjMocoC" is the Morris County Clerk in Morristown. I, of course, went to the library since newspapers are more accessible at the library than the

county clerk's office. The abbreviations "(pm)" and "(nm)" meant "positive microfilm "and "negative microfilm " respectively. The "pm" told me ahead of time that I would be reading the newspaper on a microfilm reader.

Here are the general steps to follow to find a newspaper reference book:

- Use the computer catalog either online at home
 (http://catalog.houstonlibrary.org/search ~S1/) or at a Clayton computer terminal
- 2. Use a "Keyword Search" with your state and the word "newspaper"; only look for books at Clayton Library.
- 3. Record the title of the books and the library call numbers.
- 4. Find the newspaper reference books in the library.
- 5. Use the books to tell you where you can get old copies of newspapers.

A similar technique may be used in planning a visit to other libraries that have online catalogs. For example, a keyword search of the Family History Library Catalog (http://www.familysearch.org/Eng/Library/FHL C/frameset_fhlc.asp) at Salt Lake City for "New Jersey newspaper" yields 176 references.

On April 30, 2005, Warren Hall Bevil and his wife Margarett Malinda Elizabeth. Mahulda Melvenia Beatty were honored with a medallion from the Daughters of the Republic of Texas. They were placed on the grave sites in the Hart's Mill Cemetery near Woodville, TX. Warren Hall Bevil was the first Bevil child born in Texas, then part of Mexico, August 10, 1826, at Sandy Creek (now Jasper, Tyler County). He was the son of John Randolph Bevil, who helped write the Constitution of the Republic of Texas, and Francis Boynton Bevil. John moved to Texas between 1824 and 1826. John was previously honored with a similar medallion. Warren died in Woodville, TX, January 23, 1865.

Warren and his siblings were listed on the 1835 census of the Bevil District of Texas. The grave of a brother, Joseph Francisca Bevil, has not yet been located.

"Hulda" was born December 7, 1831 in Georgia, and was the daughter of Thomas Beatty and Mary Jane McHenry. Thomas was also a pioneer resident. He brought his family to Texas before 1843.when his daughter Eliza was born. Hulda died November 11, 1908 in Woodville, TX.

Warren and Hulda's great-great-grand daughters Eugenia Letbetter, Jane Bevil Honovich and Oletia Teas and third great grand daughter Gennie' Liles set the marker during the annual spring cemetery clean-up.

Mrs. Eugenia Letbetter, Sandra Hargrove and others are working to have the cemetery recognized as a Texas Historic Burial Ground. Oletia Teas is a member of Houston Genealogical Forum and Bay Area Genealogical Society.


