Born and raised in Europe, Von received his BA and MA degrees in anthropology from the University of Texas at Austin and did additional work in American studies at the University of Colorado and in genealogy through Brigham Young University. He has produced several publications: Index to the Trail Drivers of Texas, The Volkfest in Brenham, Texas, A Sojourn in Texas. 1846-47 (a translation of the experience of an early German traveler in Texas),

German Emigration Ships to New Orleans, 1865-1869 and most recently *Voyage to North America, 1844-45* (a translation with notes of Prince Carl of Solms' Texas diary; Solms coordinated the movement of German settlers into Texas and became the founder of New Braunfels). His current project is the translation and compilation of letters and diaries by a group of German-Texans who served in Waul's Texas Legion in the Civil War.

Mr. Von-Maszewski was president of the German-Texan Heritage Society for several terms and in the year 2000 he was invited to Germany to speak on emigration as well as the commercial relationship between the port of Bremerhaven, Germany, and the port of Galveston in the 1800s. Professionally, Mr. Von-Maszewski is a Certified Genealogical Records Searcher (CGRS) and the manager of the Genealogy and Local History Department at George Memorial Library in Richmond, Texas.

Now I ask for help from every member to make our society even better! 
There are some missing pieces in the results of our genealogical research. The missing pieces are personal stories about the people we are researching. I know many of our BAGS members have personal stories, but are you writing them down or recording them for future generations? Is there a family story that is not permanently recorded? Has there been a special event in your life recently that should be written down?

The recent threat to Houston by Hurricane Rita should have provided many stories that can be written for posterity. Have you recorded how you prepared and what you did if you stayed to wait out the hurricane? If you evacuated, then you can write about the problems you experienced. Some of the BAGS Board members have written down their experiences; what about you and your family members? What I have written about the period when Hurricane Rita threatened is posted on our website. You can provide valuable information to future genealogists and family members by writing about the special events of your life.

On a different topic, I can no longer be a monthly contributor for this newsletter. I was planning articles for the next year and actually hoped to get ahead and have several months of articles ready for publication but my planning has not worked out. I have recently concluded that I have to cut back on some activities. I realize that this is an abrupt announcement and when I first made this decision, I wondered if I should give several months notice, but realized that giving a long notice is not of any advantage to the organization. 


