Then, you add your own personal touch and style.

Design: Charts Overview

As your family tree grows larger, charts help you visualize the "big picture" and provide an attractive way to display your family tree.

Family Tree Maker lets you select from a broad range of charts to meet every need and preference. Charts can be customized in an almost infinite variety of ways.

Design: Different Types of Charts


The types of charts that can be created with Family Tree Maker can be categorized by content and appearance.

You can design and print charts that show an individual's ancestors, descendants, both, and even an "all in one" tree that includes siblings. The particular types of information to be printed about each person can be specified to meet your needs.

Personal tastes vary as to exactly what the "ideal family tree" should look like. Family Tree Maker lets you design the layouts that work best for you. Charts can display family information vertically, horizontally, with or without boxes and borders, and in any fonts you have available. You can also include photos, both with individuals and as background.

Probably the best-known type is the traditional Pedigree Chart that starts with one individual and displays his/her ancestors to a certain number of generations. This is what most people think of when they hear the term "family tree." We're going to design and print a standard ancestor tree, which is visually more interesting.


Navigate to and highlight your name in the Pedigree

View. Click on the **Tree Charts** toolbar button and select **Ancestor Tree - Standard**. The Chart window appears displaying an ancestor tree. The Chart toolbar appears on the right side of the screen.

Click the **Format** button on the Chart toolbar (the top button). The Tree Format window appears. Make sure that the following are selected: **Custom** (in the Type area), **Overlap** (in Connections), **Squished** (in Layout), and the **Center tree on page(s)** checkbox. When you've verified these selections, click the **OK** button.

Click the **Number of Generations** toolbar, select **3** in the Select number window, and click the **OK** button.

Click the **Box**, **Line**, **and Border Styles** toolbar button. On the Boxes tabbed page, click **Females**, press and hold Shift, then click **Males**. Both Females



and Males should be highlighted. On the Box style area, click the second box from the right. Click the **Borders** tab and click on the top right box in the Border style area and click **OK** button.

Click the **Text Font and Style** toolbar button . Try experimenting with different font styles, sizes, and color.

Click **Contents** on the menu bar, then click Title & Footnote on the pop-up window. The Title & Footnote window appears. Click **Custom title** and enter your name. Click the **Draw box around footnote** check box

and click **OK**. Click the **Save View** toolbar button. This lets you save this chart for future use.

Print your finished chart by clicking the Print button on the toolbar.

To get some creative ideas, click **Format** on the menu bar, then click **Family Tree Templates**. Try different formats to see how they change your chart. Feel free to experiment with your own charts.




