"The Value of Newspapers in Genealogical Research"



LYNNA KAY SHUFFIELD will speak on the "The Value of Newspapers in Genealogical Research." Find out why these labor-intensive newspaper resources will benefit your search for family and local history.

The use of newspapers is essential in genealogical research in regions and time periods where no vital records were kept, or did exist but have been destroyed. The advertisements, legal notices, editorial comments, local news, high school graduation lists,

arrest reports, and "gossip" found in newspapers can provide interesting genealogical research leads. Newspapers in port cities often printed lists of ships that were arriving or departing. These reports included the ship's name, its captain, the type of vessel and the port of origin or in the case of an outbound vessel its destination. Sometimes the names of the persons importing the cargo and the cargo itself were identified.

Lynna Kay is a native Houstonian, and a former major in the State Military Forces of Texas. She is a graduate of the U.S. Marine Corps Command and General Staff College in June 1998. U.S. Army Military Police Officers Basic & Advance Schools, and the Combined Arms & Services Staff School (Reserve Component).

Lynna Kay is Texas Gen Web (TXGenWeb) County Coordinator for Milam County and San Jacinto County websites. She received the Outstanding Genealogy Website in Texas award, presented by Texas State Genealogical Society, for her Milam County TXGenWeb site in 2003 and 2004. In 2004, the Texas State Genealogical Society also honored her as Volunteer of the Year, the highest award that is presented to a genealogist in Texas every year.

She is a member of the Genealogical Speakers Guild, International Society of Family History Writers and Editors, and many local and state genealogical societies including the Daughters of the American Revolution and the United Daughters of the Confederacy. She lectures frequently at major colleges and universities throughout the United States as well as for genealogy and historical societies and veteran groups.

## March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2007 Seminar at University Baptist Church




