Silica gel can be used as a desiccant by placing it with damp materials to absorb moisture, or in an enclosed area to maintain a specific relative humidity. Artifacts should not be in direct contact with the gel.

Washington's armies marched 450 miles to defeat the British led by Cornwallis at Yorktown in the summer of 1781. Message from the President

As the calendar year is coming to a close, I am very proud of the many "CAN DO" accomplishments by our BAGS members this last twelve months.

We have continued to publish excellent monthly newsletters and quarterly reports containing informative and quality contributions to genealogical research in general. Many BAGS members have submitted wonderful articles that our proofreaders and editor have compiled into informative finished documents.

Outstanding entertaining and educational speakers have graced us with their presence and their knowledge each month. We have learned about immigration, migration trails, naturalization, Internet aids, frontier Texas, British research, local Seabrook, Texas happenings, 1890 census alternatives, and the value of newspapers and maps in discovering more about our ancestors.

Because of the efforts of our board, the Allen County Library in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, now includes BAGS publications in their international PERSI (PERiodical Source Index) database and we are members of the Federation of Genealogical Societies.

BAGS members established and heartily contribute to the telephone committee, improving our internal communications, and supporting our publicity committee that provides ongoing external communications and advertisement of our meetings, events, etc. Members provided an outstanding August "Show and Tell" which included a successful book sale. We organized and prepared the October 2006 "Remembering Our Military Ancestors" display at the Freeman Memorial Library.

Your BAGS board continues to negotiate with a large local cemetery to have the opportunity to transcribe and publish their headstone information. We hope this project will come to fruition in the next few months. This cemetery has never been transcribed so the entire genealogical community is anxiously awaiting their decision and several other local organizations have offered their assistance in the true genealogical community spirit.

Of course, all of these above efforts were in addition to the ongoing maintenance of our wonderful website, the regularly scheduled county bus trip program, daily support of our many administrative functions, and completion of a very successful genealogical seminar in September that attracted attendees from all over the state.

Preparations for 2007 meetings and planned activities are moving rapidly. This includes BAGS co-sponsorship with the Clayton Library Friends to host a genealogical conference with NARA Director, National Institute of Genealogical Research, Claire Miré Bettag, as the featured speaker on March 24, 2007. Additionally, new recipes for the BAGS cookbook project

are pouring in and we are on schedule for a June publication.

BAGS is an exceptional organization of which we can all be very proud!

"George Washington" and I are looking forward to seeing you at the annual Christmas Party on Friday December 15th.



In September 2006, ProQuest announced PERiodical Source Index (PERSI) has been updated to include over 235,000 articles published in 2004 and 2005. PERSI now contains nearly 2 million citations from over 6,500 genealogy and local history periodicals published in the United States and Canada since 1800. Search for a specific surname, locality, periodical, or how-to advice. You can access PERSI within HeritageQuest database available at many Texas public libraries.

Helen Hall Library in League City provides a monthly "how-to-use" class on HeritageQuest database including PERSI. Registration is required: 281-554-1102.
