Speaker: Susan Kaufman, MLIS



Natural disasters such as hurricanes are usually forecasted. However, events might occur for which you do not have days to prepare. How can we keep our family history documents, photos, notes, etc. together and ready to go at a moments notice? Especially when they are currently in boxes filling all the available space in our homes and possibly garages. Ms. Kaufman will

discuss preparedness, archival storage, and repair of materials all designed to get you going on saving your family history "stuff."

Susan D. Kaufman is currently Manager of the Clayton Library Center for Genealogical Research in Houston (www.houstonlibrary.org/clayton). She has worked as a genealogy librarian for 18 years. Six of those years were spent at the Allen County Public Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana. She began her career as the genealogy librarian in Peoria, Illinois at the Peoria Public Library.

Ms. Kaufman has been involved in genealogical librarianship and genealogical societies since 1987. She offers expertise in genealogical historical reference, collection development, and educational outreach. Her collection development skills include acquiring one-of-a-kind resources, government documents, and other hard-to-find research materials. She has worked with local, state, and national genealogical societies both as a board member and as a presenter at conferences. Currently, she is a director for the nationally recognized Federation of Genealogical Societies (FGS) board. In 2006, she served as annual FGS National Conference Co-Chair.

The Mt. Olivet Cemetery Transcription Project is moving along at a brisk pace. Fourteen teams consisting of 31 volunteers have completed the training process. Initial transcriptions of St. Bonaventure and the majority of St. Dominic are complete, along with most of the mausoleum. As the weather gets warmer, we anticipate a slow-down in the process but have planned for that event in our scheduled completion date of April 2008. We are very fortunate to have such dedicated volunteers within BAGS and the other local organizations who are assisting in this project: Sam Houston and George Washington Chapters of the National Society, Daughters of the American Revolution; Fort Virginia Point Chapter of United Daughters of the Confederacy: and the League City Genealogical Society.

Neil Miserendino is chairing the electronic data entry activities. He would appreciate your assistance.

Resa Hennings and Claudia Grafton are overseeing the "verification" process to validate each entry for accuracy. They would appreciate your assistance.

Each name is linked to a digital image of the original record. Viewing the digital image is free. For a fee, you can purchase a hard copy. You can view the digital images only after installing the Viewpoint® plug-in provided by the website. 
