June Meeting: "My Heroes: The Code Talker and the Commandant"



Speaker: Alice Braud-Jones

Alice Braud-Jones honors her friend Samuel William Billison, Ph.D., a World War II Navajo Code Talker, and General Michael W. Hagee, a former United States Marine Corps (USMC) Commandant. Dr Billison received the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (NSDAR) Medal of Honor in Washington D.C, July 2004. During that visit, Alice and Dr. Billison were fortunate to meet the USMC highest-ranking officer. In a tribute to all military veterans and on the eve of Independence Day 2007, Ms. Braud- Jones pays homage to the "Code Talker and the Commandant."

Alice is a native Texan and an avid genealogist. She has carefully tracked and proven many of her ancestral lines back to the 15th and 16th centuries through careful study and on-site research at local, national and international repositories. Alice is currently serving as the BAGS 1st Vice President, BAGS Coordinator for the Mt. Olivet Cemetery Transcription Committee, and Clayton Library Friends Board of Directors Secretary. She holds memberships in many genealogical and lineage societies including NSDAR where she serves as a national, state and chapter officer; United Daughters of the Confederacy as a chapter officer; and National Society U. S. Daughters of 1812.

Ms. Braud-Jones served on other boards of directors throughout her 30-year professional career, including a 6-year gubernatorial appointment to the Texas State Board of Examiners, Licensed Professional Counselors, where she was vice chairman of the board. Other experience includes over a decade of service as president, vice president and treasurer of the Houston Area Health Care Coalition. As a firm believer in continuing education, Alice has completed numerous related courses including the National Institute of Genealogical Research (NIGR) and the Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy. Additionally, she is a 7-year alum of Samford University's Institute of Genealogical and Historical Research (BIGHR).

Summer is here! Many of us will have the opportunity to visit locations where our ancestors once lived. Many others will have the opportunity to see relatives and in conversations learn more about our families.

These are excellent chances to collect and record genealogy facts. During your trips, plan to stop at the local courthouses and read the old newspapers. The courthouse records will not only provide the years your ancestors lived in that area, but will also provide personal data (occupation, economic levels, education, honors, public service and even "black sheep" incidents) and present clues to more information. The old newspapers contain articles that are entertaining to read and hopefully provide more family information.

Every relative remembers different things. Many times his or her individual memories include information that will "trigger" someone else to remember something else. These different stories can then be combined to produce a much better picture regarding the whole family.

The more we dig for information, the more information we will find to help fill-in the missing blanks regarding our ancestors. When we record this information, others will be able to use it to help find even more family data. The current information about the family and ourselves will be invaluable for our descendants. Just think of the information you wished our ancestors had recorded years ago and record that today.

Learning about our past ancestors and our present extended family is fun!

Did you know the Alfred R. Neumann Library at the University of Houston Clear Lake is a selective Federal and State depository library? The collection located on second level of the library. Gay Carter is the Government Documents Reference Librarian at the Neumann Library. One Monday July 9, 7:00pm at the Friendswood Library, Ms. Carter will discuss the genealogical nuggets her library has to offer.

Federal publications and other information products (e.g. old maps, historical documents) are freely accessible by the public in Federal depository libraries (FDL) throughout the United States. You can locate a FDL using the online U.S. Government Printing Office website (GPO Access) <u>http://www.gpoaccess.gov/libraries.html</u>. One this page, either select the state or territory, or enter an area code to retrieve the complete address, phone number, and website for each FDL located in that area.






Wanted: Newsletter Compositor
