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Message from the President

Resa Nichols Hennings

I thought you might be interested in the results of the "Tell Us What You Think" questionnaire offered to the membership in June. There were 64 responses, representing 36% of our members. Of the respondents, 29 have been a member for 5 years or longer and 27 have been a member for less than 5 years. Keep in mind not all questions we



less than 5 years. Keep in mind not all questions were answered by every respondent and some questions had more than one answer—so the numbers are not going to jibe.

The top 3 favorite things about BAGS: 1) people/fellowship, 2) program, and 3) speakers. Favorite speakers are: 1) Emily Anne Croom, 2) Dr. James Hodges as Sam Houston, 3) Kathryn Black Morrow, and 4) "all the speakers bring something." There was hardly any response to the "least favorite speaker" question. The program topic is the meeting attraction. Favorite topics run the gamut from local history, Internet, brick walls, state research, courthouses, computers, research techniques, and cemeteries to European research. "How to" programs are the most popular. The top four topics members would like to see in programming are: 1) learning more about the Internet, relative to genealogy, 2) having Clayton librarians address us regularly, 3) a comparison of computer genealogy programs, and 4) having BAGS members answer our questions.

Average attendance per responding member is 7.9 meetings a year. Conducting 12 monthly meetings is acceptable to 84%, however, 40 people prefer to not meet every month, with about a third preferring to skip December. Meeting on Friday evening is convenient for 88% while 15 people request Sunday meetings and 5 request Saturday meetings. For 78% of those responding, 6:00 pm is a convenient time to meet. The present meeting agenda and duration are acceptable by the majority. Several people believe the Invocation is too long. Potluck dinners are not important to 61% and an even higher percentage do not want catered dinners at regular meetings. The majority believe our annual dues are reasonable and 44% would be bothered by an increase (or depends on how much). About half of those responding visit the BAGS website more than once a month. Research Books on New England

Mary Martin has provided a list of helpful resources for people researching ancestors in New England, especially Massachusetts. These books contain alphabetical lists of people who immigrated to the New England area in the early colonial period of this country. Most of the materials are available at the Clayton Library. A portion of that list is printed here. The complete list can be found online at the <u>BAGS website</u> and click on "Articles" link, or directly access the list <u>here</u>.

- The Great Migration Begins: Immigrants to New England, 1620-1633; Robert Charles Anderson. There are 3 volumes. They are located in the USA section of the Clayton Library.
- The Great Migration: Immigrants to New England, 1634-1635; Robert Charles Anderson; Volumes A-B, C-F, G-H, I-L, M-P are in print. They are located in the USA section of the Clayton Library.
- 3. *The Pioneers of Massachusetts* by Charles Henry Pope. This volume is located in the Massachusetts section of the Clayton Library.
- 4. A Genealogical Register of the First Settlers of New England by John Farmer. This book is located in the USA section of the Clayton Library.

Question: Anyone working in Tennessee? My g.g.grandfather came home from the Civil War (home being Gilmer Co, GA). He ran away with the local widow woman to TN and was shot by Mast Defore – I don't know where in TN nor the lady's name. How can I find 1865 TN newspapers telling of the killing or possibly court records when I don't know the county in TN?

Answers: Melodey Hauch reports the 1860 Tennessee census does not have Defores but there are Devores in Henderson and Hickman Counties and Devours in Decatur County. Alice Braud-Jones suggests consulting the Tennessee newspaper lists provided by the *Cyndi's List* online directory

The Board began considering a way to promote good research in family history and formed the Scholarship Committee in January of this year. Since then, the Scholarship Committee has been gathering ideas and brainstorming about scholarships and award. Our primary goal was to make the award money really count for something so we went back to basics and took a look at the purpose of the organization as stated in Article II of the Constitution printed in *BAGS Yearbook 2007-2008*, page 37:

The primary purpose of the Society is educational. This will be accomplished by engaging in activities that promote public interest in genealogy and by providing knowledge and assistance to persons interested in genealogical research.

The committee decided that rather than a scholarship, we should focus our energy where it can fulfill the society's purpose. After much discussion and name change, the Awards Committee proposes that we honor our own field of endeavor by offering an award for outstanding family history/genealogy research projects. The requirements for submissions will be discussed in future newsletters.
