I feel like I have accomplished something when I can help people get to the library who are new in the community and can't get to the library easily any other way. My other position of Recording Secretary is a challenge putting our discussions on paper in a form that helps us know where we are on the projects that we are trying to accomplish, recording what we need to do next, and also recording our history as a board.

Since I have been in BAGS, I think that I may have doubled the size of my family tree or maybe, even tripled it. Going on the bus to the library nearly every month encourages me do my homework: "Who am I going to look for today, and where am I going to look for their family? Which family tree puzzle will I try to solve today by seeing how the facts that I have discovered go together?" Sometimes, I put things off too long, and this helps me keep working on my family tree. I have shared it with many of my family members. I like hearing that they are interested in what I have found about our family and where they originated from. A cousin who was living in Massachusetts copied the book that I had made for his father (my uncle). He began to plan trips with his family to these places. I think that I have received back as much as I have put into my volunteer jobs when I see how my family tree has grown. Being County Coordinator and Recording Secretary has improved my computer skills and genealogy skills in many ways because I have learned so many things from other people.

Bay Area Genealogical Society (BAGS) is sponsoring an annual award of \$250 to encourage new research in Texas history and Texas family history.

Submissions are accepted from September 1, 2009 to December 1, 2009.

The award will be presented at the March 2010 general meeting.

Papers submitted must be new, previously unpublished Texas history research or Texas family history, completed no more than two years prior to deadline.

Applicants must be Texas residents.

Seated officers, Award Selection Committee members, and their spouses and children are not eligible for the award until their term of service to BAGS is over.

Each entry will be blind reviewed by the Award Selection Committee, which will be made up of members of the BAGS Board of Directors and Committees.

President Resa Hennings recently had an e-mail from a member inquiring as to why we discontinued Pot Luck dinners, if the reason was to cut expenses, when we have over \$7,000 in our bank accounts. Here is an excerpt of her response. –Editor

At first blush, it does look like we have lots of money to spend each month, but the main reason we discontinued pot luck dinners was that the majority of the membership did not want it. In June, 2008, we put out the "Tell Us What You Think" questionnaire to the membership. Of the responses to the question "Is it important to you that we have a Pot Luck Dinner at every meeting?" 60% of those answering said "no."

That preference was coupled with the, then, new monthly charges being levied by the church. When BAGS first started in 2001 **everything** at the church was free (except for beverage service). We've had anywhere from 170-210 members through the years and dues were \$20/person. **Dues are still \$20 a person eight years later.**

Slowly, the church began to charge us for things. We had been paying the church \$30/meeting to setup the room and beverages can be up to \$12. Forty-two bucks a meeting-not bad! Then the church upped everything. The \$30 became \$55 in one fell swoop, and if we served food there would be a \$45 clean-up fee. So the \$42 became \$112. Given that 60% of the membership didn't feel dinners were necessary anyhow, it was a relatively simple decision for the board to make to cut them.

We were also going to be charged for the audio/visual equipment, which had always been totally free. There is now a \$75-\$85 fee staring us in the face *every month*, depending on if we use certain equipment that belongs to the church. The Board had been thinking that we should buy our own projection and sound equipment, which could run as high as \$2,000. Half of the money for this purchase is budgeted. But as long as we have speakers who bring their own projector or use the

church's (free) overhead projector, the society can avoid making that big A/V purchase. Some day we will probably have to bite the bullet and buy the equipment.

Some of our annual expenses: \$1,875 to print and mail the *Quarterly* and *Yearbook*; \$835 to the church for the above costs; \$730 for speakers and hand-outs; BAGS' membership dues to Texas State Genealogical Society, the Federation of Genealogical Societies, and Clayton Library Friends total a bit over \$200 (which includes our an annual gift of \$100 to CLF).

The Board discussed raising dues. We really hate to do that as many of our members are on fixed incomes and we want to make BAGS affordable to as many people as we can. Our corporate purpose is to educate in the area of genealogy, and since we are a non-profit 501(c)(3) entity, we must keep that purpose in mind as we plan our activities. If we hold a class, for example, and not enough people sign up to cover our basic expenses, then we have to dip into the checking account to cover the loss. If our membership should decline, then revenues are down and that means more dipping.

Even with the best budgeting we can do, there are unknowns. We must, therefore, have a good financial cushion, hence, the CDs and seemingly comfortable checkbook balance. I will also tell you that our Board of Directors are rather financially conservative. Each member is well aware that it is *other people's money*, we are spending, and that is taken very seriously.

Of course we could begin pot luck dinners again. There would probably have to be a nominal charge levied to cover the church fees, but something could sure be worked out if that is what the members want. We know that fellowship is one thing people really enjoy--that is why we began to advertise "socializing at 6:30; meeting at 7" in all our publications when the pot luck was dropped.
