New Digital Holocaust Collection

Through their partnership with the National Archives, Footnote.com[™] has scanned and indexed valuable records that help tell the story of the Holocaust. Over one million Holocaust-related records including millions of names and 26,000 photos from the National Archives are available online. Explore Holocaust era assets, German war crime records, captured German records, Dachau concentration camp registers, Flossenburg concentration camp entry registers, Mauthausen death books, and WWII Nuremburg interrogation records. **This collection is accessible for free from home during October**. NARA Proposed Regulation 36 CFR 1254 submitted by Alice Braud-Jones

The following notice was received from Marilyn Redman of the National Archives and Records Administration:

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) is proposing a revision to the current NARA regulations on Researcher Identification Cards. The proposed rule will require researchers using original records, NARA microfilm, and public use computers at the National Archives Building in Washington, DC, to obtain a researcher identification card. Researchers at regional archives are also required to obtain a researcher identification card when there is no separate research room for the use of microfilm and public access computers. The proposed rule also updates our regulations to reflect changes in available technology and research room practices, such as abolishing the three-hour time limit for using microfilm readers.

Galveston Museums & Library Recovery News

At the September meeting, Alecya Gallaway showed a moving presentation illustrating the destruction Hurricane Ike dealt cemeteries located on the coast in Galveston County and their recovery progress one year later thanks to funding and volunteer efforts. In addition to the presentation, Alecya shared news on the current recovery progress for several museums.

The Galveston County Historical Museum

archives were saved. The museum and the Galveston County Historical Commission have moved to the Shearn Moody Plaza building located at 25th and Strand (123 Rosenberg), Suite 4157. Although, the museum currently has no exhibitions for the public to view, they are open to accept donations for the historical artifact collection and to assist with research and other inquiries. Call for an appointment 409-766-2340.

Lone Star Flight Museum is open and on Saturdays offers flight experiences on the B-17 Flying Fortress, B-25 Mitchell, T-6 Texan, and PT-17 Stearman.

<u>Galveston Railroad Museum</u> is currently closed due to sustaining up to 11 feet of water in the facility and the train cars. However, they plan to reopen in early 2010. On the main page of the website are links to photos of the damage generated by Hurricane Ike and the recovery process aided by NASA Johnson Space Center.

The Rosenberg Library Museum is open with a number of exhibits including *The World at War: Memories of WWI & WWII* where you can view dozens of military uniforms, weapons, medals, photographic images, and other artifacts from the wars. The museum is open Tuesday through Saturday 9:00 am until 6:00 pm.

Galveston and Texas History Center at the Rosenberg Library is open Tuesday through Saturday from 9:00 am to 6:00pm. Alecya recommended calling ahead (409-763-8854 ext. 127) to request research items, allowing one of the two staff members time to pull the materials before you arrive. A sample list of the genealogy research materials available is listed online at www.gthcenter.org/genealogy.htm. The center's staff has been assisting island residents in recovering from Hurricane Ike by establishing the age of a residence or building for insurance purposes. The staff is collecting memories of Ike and photographs taken in Galveston and Galveston County during and after the storm. Galveston residents who stayed or evacuated are encouraged to submit their written memories. For information, please visit the Memories of Ike web page (http://12.185.240.10/ike/memories.htm).

Built in 1903 in a modified Gothic style of architecture, the Tyrrell Library first served as the First Baptist Church. Captain W. C. Tyrrell

purchased and donated the building for library purposes to the City of Beaumont in 1923. This gorgeous building houses Texana and genealogical book collections and outstanding archives centering on Southeast Texas. A 24 page

listing of the archive collections housed at this library is available online in a PDF formated file (<u>click here to access</u>).

The library is located at 695 Pearl, Beaumont, TX 77701 and is open Monday – Saturday 9:00am to 6:00pm. Contact the library at (409) 833-2759.
