Discover A Gold Mine in Your Backyard ... The Clayton Library

Primary source materials for advanced genealogy research are a principal focus of Clayton Library's print and microprint holdings. The following list (ordered by U.S. States) highlights a few of the significant manuscript collections at Clayton.

South Carolina: Andrea Collection

Connecticut: Barbour Collection 1640-1850

Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, Texas: Cuban Papers (Papeles Procedentes de Cuba or Legajos)

Georgia: Cook Collection

Kentucky, Ohio, and Tennessee: Draper Manuscripts 1740-1850

Maryland: Calvert Papers, 1516-1804

Massachusetts: Cape Cod Families

Massachusetts and neighboring states: Corbin Manuscript Collection 1650-1850

Tennessee: Barnes Collection 1812-1956

Texas: Robert Bruce Blake Research Collection

Virginia: Carter Family Papers 1659-1797

Content, date coverage, format, and organization details for each these manuscript collections is provided on the library's <u>website</u>.

Houston Public Library system also provides a number of electronic databases for genealogy research that can only be accessed from inside a HPL branch or only HPL Clayton Library branch due to licensing constraints. The rest can be accessed from home with a valid Houston Public Library card.

These electronic databases include:

Ancestry Library Edition (access in any HPL branch only)

Ancestry.com is one of the largest collections of family history data online.

American Civil War Research Database

Online resource for researching the soldiers, regiments, and battles of the American Civil War contains indexed, searchable information on over four million soldiers and thousands of battles, together with fifteen thousand photographs.

Access NewspaperARCHIVE (access in any HPL branch only)

The largest historic newspaper source online, containing tens of millions of searchable newspaper pages dating as far back as the 1700s.

Black Studies Center

Black Studies Center is a fully cross-searchable gateway to Black Studies including scholarly essays, recent periodicals, historical newspaper articles, and much more.

Footnote (access in any HPL branch only)

Almost 40 million images of primary source materials. Many are available here for the first time.

GenLine (access in Clayton Library only)

Swedish Church Records from the 16th - 20th century.

Jewish Data (access in Clayton Library only)

Jewish Genealogical resource that includes 500,000 records including images of tombstones, school yearbook pages and Citizen Declaration documents.

<u>New England Ancestors</u> (access in any HPL branch only)

Genealogical data from the New England Historic Genealogical Society.

19th Century U. S. Newspapers Digital Archive

Digital facsimile images for hundreds of 19th century U.S. newspapers. Includes The Galveston Daily News from 1874 until 1897 (see listing under Houston, Texas)



If you have not visited the Clayton Library, consider joining us on a bus trip this summer and see what you can discover about your ancestors. Dates and times for the trips are on page 6 of this newsletter.

Several experienced genealogists go on the BAGS bus trips to Clayton Library. They may be able to share some helpful ideas with you. The Clayton librarians are always available to help you get started finding your ancestors and there is also a packet of information the library gives to first time visitors which is very helpful. The BAGS website **www.TxBayAreaGen.org** and newsletter always has a current listing of library trips.

FamilySearch Adds 300 Million Names

Have you been indexing records for LDS Family Search? Well someone has.

On April 28, Family Search announced they are publishing an additional 300 million names to its existing family history database to be researched online for free. These names come from extracted original sources national and worldwide. The record collections indexed range in date from pre-1700 to present covering mainly vital records in Europe, India, Philippines, Australia, New Zealand, North & South America, and Samoa. Also included are the Civil War pension index cards and Revolutionary War pension and bounty land warrant applications files with links to the images that reside in Footnote.com, a subscription resource you access for free within any Houston Public Library branch.

Research this new set of record collections at the Family Search beta test website http://fsbeta.FamilySearch.org. On the home page, click on the "All Collections" <u>link</u> to see and access each new record collection, 289 collections in all. That site and several other online tools and resources, can be accessed at http://labs.familysearch.org. Family Search intends to migrate these resources to its main www.FamilySearch.org website later this year.
