Gay E. Carter will present an in-depth look at key government web sites genealogists should be using and how to use them, especially focusing on the National Archives, the Library of Congress, and a few that may be new to you!

Ms. Carter is the Reference/Documents Librarian at the Alfred R. Neumann Library, University of Houston–Clear Lake (UHCL). The library has been an official Federal Depository Library for selected U.S. government publications since 1980 and a Texas Depository Library for Texas state publications since 1988. She supervises the library's U.S. federal depository and Texas state depository collections and is active in the Government Documents Round Table of the Texas Library Association. Ms. Carter holds a Master of Library Science degree from Texas Woman's University.

She has been with UHCL since it "opened its doors" in 1974 and became a government documents librarian in 1980. Engaged in genealogical research for almost 30 years, she is a member of several genealogical organizations that include BAGS and is an alumna of the Samford University Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research (IGHR).

Resources: Texas Archives

Archives are wonderful research resources! Each archive maintains a unique set of materials. In vmost cases the materials themselves are not available online. In general, archives do not share a standard catalog or locating system for their housed materials. If you are interested in a specific archive, ask the staff if finding aids or pathfinders are available for the holdings. A finding aid provides the scope, contents, and inventory description for a specific record collection available for research. A pathfinder is a subject inventory for the holdings that lead you to a specific collection's finding aid. Many Texas archives publish finding aids to their holdings on the Web at TARO (Texas Archival Resources Online).

The Harris County Archives publish finding aids and pathfinders on their website www.hctx.net/archives. Look for the links in the navigation bar on the left-hand side of their website.

Archives of the Houston Area published a list of area archives including links to archive websites and summary brochures online at http://houstonarchivists.org/area-archives

The TXGenWeb Project has their own Texas archives database of records transcribed by volunteers that you can search on key terms (e.g. surnames) by county and record type at www.usgwarchives.net/search/search.cgi/searchtx.htm

Individual Texas county records are available on microfilm located at regional historical resource depositories (RHRD). Indexes for those county records are available online at www.tsl.state.tx.us/arc/local/index.html. Choose a specific county to view the index and determine where the films are located. For example, the Sam Houston Regional Library and Research Center in Liberty, TX maintains records for Chambers, Galveston, Hardin, Harris, Jasper, Jefferson, Liberty, Newton, Orange, Polk, San Jacinto, and Tyler counties. The Galveston Country records available on microfilm through inter-library loan from Sam Houston Library include Census 1880, County Court Civil Minutes 1867-1908, deed records 1838-1886, marriage records 1838-1907, (naturalization) declarations of intention records 1876-1906; voter registration 1853-1873. 1894; tax rolls 1838-1910; District Court general docket 1840-1913 and civil minutes 1839-1909; and probate: wills 1838-1879, minutes 1838-1906, returns of sale 1848-1879, inventory 1848-1874,

final accounts 1836-1879, administration bonds 1848-1879. (access index online)

TMG! TMG! TMG!

After seeing some of the features and capabilities The Master Genealogist (TMG) application (version 7) has to offer, I am singing its praises! Jerry Woodman provided a wonderful introduction at the June meeting. I had not seen TMG before and only heard negative comments that the application has too many features and configurable items to learn and use. However from what I saw, those features and items are fantastic benefits! For example, you can record multiple names for a person, multiple versions of a person's event with citations which handles tracking data discrepancies. No assumptions on relationships allows you to successfully document adoptive and foster child situations. Attach your family stories, digitized images (e.g. newspaper clippings, and pictures) to individuals. Import data directly from Family Origins, Family Tree Maker, Generations, Legacy, PAF Roots, Ultimate Family Tree, Family Gatherings, and Visual Roots.

Jerry Woodman will repeat this introduction at the Friendswood Public Library on Saturday, August 14 at 3:00pm.
