Government Resources

At last month's meeting, Gay Carter demystified the use of several electronic government resources to locate family history information.

For example, access the U.S. official web portal *USA.gov* (www.usa.gov) and enter "genealogy" in the search box (optionally add state or county names as additional qualifying terms). The result identifies Federal, State, and municipal government, library, and society resources. Try clicking on the "Images" link at the top of the page or the "Truly Free Genealogy Sites" link on the left-hand side of the results page.

Government Resources (continued)

Catalog of U.S. Government Publications website (http://catalog.gpo.gov) provides a basic index to both depository and non-depository documents from all agencies. Try a search using the term "genealogy" (optionally add state or event as additional qualifying terms). Find a document of interest? If an electronic copy exists, a link will be provided under the Internet Access column. Otherwise, write down the "SuDoc Number" and contact reference librarian at the UHCL Neumann Library (281) 283-3910 to request the item.

Visit the World Digital Library (www.wdl.org) to study international history through primary materials from countries and cultures around the world. Read the actual Journal of Captain Cook's Last Voyage to the Pacific Ocean, 1776-1779. Listen to 101-yearold Fountain Hughes recalling his boyhood as a slave, the Civil War, and life in the United States as an African American from the 1860s to the 1940s. Watch the arrival of emigrants at Ellis Island in 1906. Browse by country, time period, format (books, iournals, manuscripts, maps, prints and photographs, films, and sound recordings), or institution to access these rare and unique documents. Click on an image to access a historical description of that item and a link to access the complete book, map, photo, audio or video clip.
