Interested in Norwegian culture, history, and genealogy? BAGS is proud to host Blaine Hedberg who is the Naeseth Chair for Research and Publication for the Norwegian American Genealogical Center (NAGC) and Naeseth Library located in Madison, Wisconsin (www.nagcnl.org). Mr. Hedberg is an international leader in Norwegian genealogical research. The NAGC & Naeseth Library is among the world's leading resources for Norwegian and Norwegian-American genealogy. Through collections, research, outreach, and publications, this center continually builds upon its role as the most comprehensive source of information about Norwegian immigrants, their ancestors, and their descendants. Bygdebøker are a genre of Norwegian local history literature containing information about rural districts and the people who lived within

those districts. It has long been thought the combined collection of Bygdebøker at the NAGC & NL and

those held at the University of Wisconsin – Memorial Library, in Madison, Wisconsin, provide the most extensive collection in such close proximity to each other outside of Norway. This program is free. Visitors are welcome. No registration required. Park in the lot nearest to Middlebrook Drive and use the entrance facing that street.



Free Resources at FamilySearch and your local FHC

At last month's meeting, Sue Yerby provided an entertaining and informative program on the resources available through online *FamilySearch* and local LDS Family History Centers. Sue's research mantra is "There has to be a document. There just has to be. It is just either not published, not transcribed or indexed online, or I have not looked in the correct place ... Yet!" Keep looking! During this year with the help of volunteers, the images and indexes for over 7 million records were added to *FamilySearch* resources. Each year there will be more! Periodically check the *FamilySearch* resources for newly indexed records or information pertaining to your family research.



The new beta-version of *FamilySearch* (https://beta.familysearch.org) provides access to 470 worldwide historical record collections by surname, place, date, or category. Some collections include the digitized record images that can be saved to your computer and printed. Alternatively, browse the collection list and narrow down choices by time period, locations and/or category. The camera icon indicates an image of the original record is available. Choose a record collection to search within that specific collection.

For example the *Texas Deaths 1890-1976* record collection includes images of the Texas death certificates. I found the death certificate for my great grandfather James Aaron Moore, a physician who died of influenza during the epidemic in 1918. The certificate lists his birth date, where he is buried,

names of his parents and their birth places as remembered by James' wife. Searching the surname Moore with death year 1918 returned 34,710 matches. I reduced the search results to 215 by using the advanced search to choose "match all terms exactly" and set 1918 +/- value to 0. Adding the first name James to the search reduced the results to 3!

Search the <u>Family History Library online catalog</u> to identify microfilms important to your research. Search by "place" and enter one broad word (e.g. Kentucky). In the left sidebar, narrow the results by selecting time period, record category, availability location and/or language. Choose a specific entry and review the notes, subject list and language (i.e. English) information within the title's details for hints on the film's contents. If this title has been microfilmed, a "Film Notes" section will be included. That section contains the film number needed to order that film at your local FHC at a cost of \$5.50 per roll to use within the FHC for one month. The <u>Research Wiki</u> provides "how to" advice for researching government, church, and public records in a specific country, state or county.

The <u>Research Courses</u> provide free online "sit & listen" video courses on the basic methods and key resources for genealogy research in specific countries (e.g. England, France, Mexico, New Zealand, Poland, Russia, United States).

Want to be an indexing volunteer? Just click on **Indexing** to get started.

The Family History Centers (FHC) have purchased licenses to several electronic databases and provide free access within a FHC to the public. Here are a few of those resources you can use for your research. Just another reason to visit a local Family History Center.

Within *The American Civil War Research Database* you can research the individuals, regiments, and battles of the American Civil War with indexed searchable information on 4.3 million soldiers and thousands of battles, together with 16,000 photographs. It contains all of the more than 4,600 known regimental rosters, 3,461 regimental chronicles, 1,010 officer profiles, pension index records, 1860 census records, GAR records, Roll of Honor records, Medal of Honor records and regimental histories. Information has come from personal items, graveyards and newspaper reports.

The American Civil War: Letters and Diaries knit together more than 400 sources of diaries, letters, and memoirs, to provide fast access to thousands of views on almost every aspect of the war. This extraordinary electronic collection includes 100,000 pages of re-keyed and indexed text, including 4,000 facsimile pages of previously unpublished manuscript material.

19th Century British Library Newspapers provides images of more than 2 million pages from 48 top national and regional newspapers in Victorian Britain.

Genline.com (also accessible at Clayton Library) offers access to original Swedish Church Records from the 1600s to 1930s including births, marriages, deaths, household examinations books, clerical registrations and movement in and out of the parishes.

Godfrey Memorial Library provides an extensive collection of city and business directories. Unique digitized in-house content includes 4,000 genealogies, biographies, memoirs and funeral sermons. Provides access to 19th century newspapers, African American newspapers and *London Times* digital archives.
