Software Reviews

TopTenREVIEWS, Inc. published an online matrix comparison of the top ten applications available for Windows computers titled <u>2011</u> <u>Genealogy Software Review</u> and six applications available for Mac computers titled <u>2011 Best Mac Genealogy Software</u> <u>Comparisons and Reviews</u>. The reviews include ratings, data entry, data management, views, reports, charts, online integration, reporting, publishing, help, and support.

The Internet Genealogy magazine December/January 2011 issue published an article "Genealogy Software For The Apple Mac" by Edward Zapletal (pages 8-11) where he reviews the following software products available for Mac users: Family Tree Maker Mac 2010, GEDitCOM II ver 1.5, Genealogy Pro ver 2.2, GenScribe, GRAMPS, Heredis Mac X.2, iFamily for Leopard, MacFamilyTree, MyBlood, Personal Ancestry Writer II, and Reunion.

Digitizing Photos?

Are the photographs you are scanning faded or have a beige or reddish cast over them? A photo editing software tool can be used to "clean up" the digital image of a photograph by manipulating the color and contrast assignments. This type of tool can also provide features to digitally correct tears and mildew spots. Picasa (picasa.google.com) and Picnik (www.picnik.com) are two free photo editing tools offered by Google for used on both Windows and Mac computers. The article "Picture Perfect" by Diane Haddad and Christy Miller in Family Tree Magazine January 2011 issue on pages 11-15 provide step-by-step instructions using Picasa to remove fading, reddish casting, tears, and spotting on a digital photo image.

Roots in Finland?

'Need to "Finnish" Your Genealogy Research?' by Diane L. Richard in *Internet Genealogy* magazine December/January 2011 issue, pages 17-21 discusses online resources available for researching ancestors from Finland. The article covers church records, passport and passenger records, published newspapers between 1771 and 1900, and translation resources. This magazine is available at your local library.

The 150th anniversary (sesquicentennial) of the United States Civil War begins April 12, 2011

The hostilities began when Confederate forces attacked a U.S. military installation at Fort Sumter in South Carolina on that date.

"When President Lincoln planned to send supplies to Fort Sumter, he alerted the state in advance, in an attempt to avoid hostilities. South Carolina, however, feared a trick; the commander of the fort, Robert Anderson, was asked to surrender immediately. Anderson offered to surrender, but only after he had exhausted his supplies. His offer was rejected, and on April 12, the Civil War began with shots fired on the fort. Fort Sumter eventually was surrendered to South Carolina." 
