She supervises the depository collections and is active in the Government Documents Round Table of the Texas Library Association. Ms. Carter holds a Master of Library Science degree from Texas Woman's University. She has been with UHCL since it "opened its doors" in 1974 and became a government documents librarian in 1980. Casting your net over free online resources using *Mocavo.com*

Available to the public for free, <u>Mocavo.com</u> launched on March 16, 2011 with the goal to provide access to all of the world's free genealogy information with one search



interface. The website is designed to "discover" new sites every day. Simply type in the names of interest and click on Search. All related results from "industry sources such as genealogy message boards, family trees, state and local historical societies, the Library of Congress, National Archives, Ellis Island, Find A Grave, the Internet Archive, various U.S. state archives, and many tens of thousands of genealogy sites built by individuals will be displayed." [from the *Mocavo.com* "About" page]

For example, a search on the surname Schondelmaier generated results matching on the names of people submitting or providing the data (i.e. a link to possible living cousins) as well as record content. The matches included cemetery transcriptions from *FindAGrave.com*, lineage information from a personal website hosted on *InterCom.net*, message board postings on *Ancestor.com* and *Genealogy.com*, newspaper obituary index on *RootsWeb* the free portion of *Ancestry.com*, county WWII enlistment entries on *USGenWeb.org* archives, a city directory transcription from Trenton Historical Society, and a passenger list on *EllisIsland.org*.

The current search interface does not provide options to limit the results. So consider adding additional search terms describing locations, occupations, organizations or record types such as: cemetery, marriage, passenger, "city directory", lineage, or "military records." Using double quotes around names will engage searching for first name then last name, last name then first name, and compensate for possibility of middle names or initials listed in the records. Other tips for using the *Mocavo.com* search engine are posted on their blog entry **Some Quick Tips on Using** <u>Mocavo</u>, published March 17, 2011. Links to State Archives

Thanks to Mary Martin, BAGS Recording Secretary, for providing a list of U.S. state archives with direct links originally published in *Ancestry Daily News*. This list is accessible online in the *Ancestry.com* archives titled **Reference Corner: Links to State Archives,** published September 9, 2002. Often a state archive website will provide special sections for genealogists and free online record databases.

The job of preservationist extends beyond records, stories, and buildings...

During the Clayton library reconstruction, BAGS First Vice President Claudia Grafton, who is also the current President of Clayton Library Friends (CLF), made it her mission to

save the beautiful iris and lily flower bulbs that have been a part of the library's landscaping for decades. Claudia enlisted the help of Chris Wiesinger, known as the "bulb hunter," who owns Southern Bulb Company near Tyler, Texas and specializes in heritage

bulbs. With less than 24 hours notice, Claudia, her husband James, and Chris collected about 400 iris bulbs and about 400 lily bulbs. Chris nurtured the bulbs until the construction project was complete. Now many of the bulbs have been replanted and are being cared for by Harris County Master Gardeners (HCMG), some who live as far away as Katy and Clear Lake. The plants are thriving and are expected to bloom in April. Stop by the library to see them and appreciate the labor of love provided by the Graftons, Chris Wiesinger, and HCMG. Bulbs that were not replanted may be used as a fundraiser for CLF for the benefit of the Clayton Library.

Roots in Italy?

Last month, Nick Cimino provided an entertaining and informative program on resource information needed for people to begin researching ancestors in Italy. Nick recommended two books: *Italian Genealogical Records: How to Use Italian Civil, Ecclesiastical & Other Records in Family History Research* by Trafford R. Cole published in 1995 and *Our Italian Surnames* by Joseph G. Fucilla published in 1987. Both are available at the Clayton Library, Amazon.com, and through inter-library loan. Nick volunteers research assistance at the Clayton House on Friday afternoons from 2:00pm to 4:30pm. He will be providing the same program at the Italian Cultural and Community Center on April 14 at 7:00pm. The center is located at 1101 Milford, Houston, TX (<u>online map</u>). In commemoration of the Civil War, *Ancestry.com* is opening their entire *Civil War Collection,* accessible at <u>www.ancestry.com/civilwar150,</u> to everyone the week of April 7-14. You will be able to search without a subscription.

The highlights are the newly-digitized National Archives "Civil War Draft Registration Records, 1863-1865," "U.S. Soldiers Compiled Service Records, 1861-1865" and "U.S. Soldiers Compiled Service Records, 1861-1865."

Culinary Preservation

Food recipes are wonderful documents to include in your collected family history, especially if you can include a photo of the cook or any family stories surrounding a meal including the dish. Family recipes provide a glimpse into a family's heritage, linking us to ancestors and either a special event or daily life. A collection of family

recipes make nice personal gifts for wedding and baby showers. Consider giving a *BAGS Cookbook* as a Mother's Day gift. Purchase one for \$15 at the next general meeting.
