Friday, September 30, 2011: Deborah Cole presents Tips & Tricks from the 2011 FGS Conference

Public Invited. Join us at 6:30pm for coffee and socializing.

We meet at the University Baptist Church in the Great Room, 2nd floor. (16106 Middlebrook Drive, Clear Lake City - online map)

BAGS member Deborah Cole attended the Federation of Genealogical Societies (FGS) annual conference "Pathways to the Heartland" held in Springfield, Illinois on September 7-10, 2011. She will share tips and tricks received from some of the classes. Four days of programming covered topics of research & reconstruction strategies; technology tools; lowa, Scots-Irish, National Archives, and 1940 U.S. Census research; material preservation and restoration; and society promotion.

Deborah has been working on genealogy off and on since the age of 16. Lately she has been actively working on documenting the Wilson Family Cemetery in southern Anderson County, TX. She has created a survey and researched the lives of those buried there and interviewed current living family members. Some of these materials were presented at last



month's Show & Tell. The surnames found in the cemetery are: Wilson, Powell, Farmer, Knighten, Harris, Isbell, White, Luke, House, Beatty, Edwards, McCall, Denson, Harper, Stephens, and Weatherly--all related directly or through marriage to Andrew Wilson, Jr., who was born in South Carolina in 1806 and moved to Texas in 1850.

Deborah earned a BA in History with a minor in Writing from Stephen F. Austin State University. She is currently employed as a Sr. Administrative Assistant for a commercial real estate company.




Show & Tell - Great Fun!

Members shared wonderful items and advice at last month's Show & Tell program

Several members have been busy creating family history books. Maurine Lee's book includes her grandmother's handwritten notes detailing her courtship and early-married life in the 1880s.




Eleanor Caldwell and her daughter created a beautiful book for the Gullett Family Reunion in July 2011 that includes photos and images of primary source records such as slave documents, WWI draft cards, and marriage certificates. Eleanor also shared the 1933 Morehouse College graduation announcement book for her father George Russell Finley. The book contains graduates' names, program schedule and photographs.

discovered the German spelling of his great-greatgrandfather's name to be Frederick G. Mejo and a 72 page biographical essay. Mejo was the last bookbinder for President Thomas Jefferson.

Michael McCowen discussed his success in locating cousins by participating in Family Tree DNA's family finder test. Nick Cimino discussed his success in connecting with people after loading vital information from an inherited German Bible into the online RootsWeb WorldConnect Project.

Finding and Using Manuscript and Special Collections Repositories: A lecture on how using manuscripts and special collections as sources of information can help fill in gaps in your family's history.

Southern Deeds: More than Land: To most people, deeds are nothing more than land transactions. Find out how Southern deeds can be the key to unlocking vaults of valuable information that would surprise many.

Railroad Records and Railroad History: Methods for Tracking: Many people's ancestors traversed the nation working for the railroad. This lecture demonstrates the wealth of historical materials available all across the US, and how to find it.

The WPA Era: What it Created for Genealogists: During the 1930's and 1940's the Works Progress/Projects Administration put many people to work and created a goldmine such as record transcriptions, courthouse and manuscript inventories, indexes, city/county histories, and histories of businesses and families. Learn here what may be available for you.

Susie Ganch reminded us that reading historic fiction is an entertaining way to study the political, social and economic issues during specific time periods. The following books were recommended by Susie:

New York by Edward Rutherford – History of New York City area from 1664 to present.

Fall of Giants by Ken Follett - Follow five interrelated families (American, German, Russian, English and Welsh) as they live through WWI, the Russian Revolution and women's suffrage. (first of a trilogy)

Winter Garden by Kristin Hannah – Life in Leningrad during WWII.

Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society by Mary Ann Shaffer – Life on Guernsey Island, Europe during WWII German occupation. Water for Elephants by Sara Gruen – Great Depression era from the perspective of a struggling circus and it's workers.

Isaac's Storm by Erik Larson – 1900 Galveston Hurricane based on letters, telegrams, and reports from Isaac Monroe Cline, the resident senior U.S. Weather Bureau official, and testimony of survivors.

Reading List Resources

Register through your local public library to receive periodic e-mails from **NextReads**' containing historical fiction reading lists (example: **August 2011 issue**).

Historical Fiction: Reading Lists for Every Taste by Brad Hooper lists popular historical fiction titles described and categorized according to their underlying appeal features, topics and themes.

Historical Fiction: A Guide To The Genre by Sarah Johnson lists books published between 1995 and mid-2004 containing stories that take place prior to 1950 and written from research, not personal experience.
