Ms. Carter is the Reference/Documents
Librarian at the Alfred R. Neumann Library,
University of Houston–Clear Lake (UHCL). The
library has been an official Federal Depository
Library for selected U.S. government
publications since 1980 and a Texas
Depository Library for Texas state publications
since 1988. She supervises the depository
collections and is active in the Government
Documents Round Table of the Texas Library
Association. Ms. Carter holds a Master of

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Library Science degree from Texas Woman's University. She has been with UHCL since it "opened its doors" in 1974 and became a government documents librarian in 1980. Engaged in genealogical research for almost 31 years, she is a member of several

When you examine most calendars, you realize that March is a very busy month for many of us. On March 11th we began Daylight Savings Time and have to set our clocks forward one hour. Our Irish friends celebrate St. Patrick's Day on March 17th; I suspect that I may have some Irish in me since I love corned beef and cabbage. The Spring season begins on March 20th; many

of us are looking forward to this after the drought we experienced last year. These are some of the most common events occurring this month. However, when I look at some of the multitude of calendars that I receive in the mail, I find other interesting tidbits of information; on March 3rd, 1931 the "Star Spangled Banner" was made the U.S. National Anthem and on March 12th, 1912 the Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. was founded.

The Texas General Office 2012 Map Calendar identifies many historical events that occurred during the month of March. On March 2, 1836 Texas declared its independence from Mexico; on March 6, 1836 the Alamo fell to the Mexican army; and on March 27, 1836 the Goliad Massacre occurred. Another interesting fact that I had forgotten was that it was not until March 30, 1870 that Texas was readmitted to the Union although the Civil War ended in 1865. These are only a few of the events that occurred in Texas history during March. For those interested in the history of their home states, you might check to see if their state publishes a similar calendar.

BAGS Joins the 1940 U.S. Census Community Project

BAGS joined forces with genealogy societies and organizations around the country as part of the 1940 U.S. Census Community Project. Indexing records from our state, we will be an essential part of this monumental grass-roots effort that will put one of the richest genealogical data sets in the world online, complete and free of charge forever.

Project Background

On April 2, 2012, images of the 1940 U.S. Federal Census will be released for the first time. Unlike previous census years, images of this census will be made available as free digital images. Upon its release, the 1940 U.S. Census Community Project, a joint initiative between Archives.com, FamilySearch, findmypast.com, and other leading genealogy societies and organizations, will coordinate efforts to provide quick access to these digital images and immediately start indexing these records to make them searchable online with free and open access.

This initiative aims to publish a free, online searchable name index of the 1940 U.S. Federal Census. This online index will be free forever, offering family history researchers a rich genealogical data set for their ongoing use. The index created by the project will allow the public to easily search every person found in the census and view digital images of the original census pages where he or she is listed.

Interest in the 1940 U.S. Census is both significant and sentimental because it documents what is often referred to as "The Greatest Generation" of U.S. citizens. As a group, these are individuals who:

- Survived the Great Depression
- · Fought in the Second World War
- Innovated technology (TV, Microwave)

There are many people alive today who will be able to find themselves in the 1940 U.S. Federal Census. Others will be able to readily connect with relatives they knew personally or through family stories. Imagine the great resource this will be to current and future society members!

Thank You Rewards

As a special thanks for our society's involvement in the 1940 U.S. Census Project, the Project Team is providing indexing thank you rewards. Thank you rewards are given for the number of names indexed per month by both societies and individuals. Societies will be tiered by size to ensure a level playing field.

Rewards for societies will include an all expenses paid onsite mini-conference, subscriptions to genealogical websites, goody bags for society members, laptops and other equipment. Individuals will be eligible for rewards such as iPads, all-in-one printers, t-shirts and entertainment tickets.



How Do You Start?

Get started now in 3 easy steps:

- 1. Download and install the FamilySearch indexing software. A **video tutorial** will show you how.
- Create a FamilySearch account. A <u>video</u> <u>tutorial</u> will show you how. (Refer to account details on page 4)
- 3. Associate yourself with BAGS when you first sign into the indexing software. A **video tutorial** is available to assist you. (Refer to account details on page 4)



Download the software and get started!

The videos and software can be accessed from the website http://the1940census.com under the "Get Started" section.

Remember that every name you contribute is indexed by another person and checked by a third person, called an arbitrator. So do your best, but don't be nervous about submitting a batch.

Details for FamilySearch Account & First Indexing Sign In

You may already have a FamilySearch or LDS Account if you have registered for another program that uses these newer accounts, such as new.familysearch.org, the FamilySearch research wiki, and the LDS Stake and Ward website. Users who already have a FamilySearch or LDS Account will not need to register again. If you do not have an account, click **Register for a New Account** on the sign-in window.

After you have registered, sign in by entering your user name and password, and click OK.

The first time you sign in, a license agreement appears. Read the license agreement, and click the box next to I agree, and then click OK.

On the Profile Information screen, select **Another group** and then select the group "**Bay Area Genealogical Society – Texas**" from the dropdown list and also enter your phone number.



FamilySearch Indexing: Helpful Training Resources To Use

First, watch a quick <u>video</u> introducing FamilySearch index terms, user interface, and demonstrates how you index a record.

Second, complete the 20 minute interactive (no audio) "Indexing Tutorial" to learn some of the details in using the indexing software to properly index information found in the image records. You will understand how to handle cases where fields or records are unreadable or partially readable, and when to leave off punctuation.

Third, watch a recorded 45 minutes webinar <u>"Introto Indexing"</u> demonstrating the entire registration and indexing process.

Register on **http://the1940census.com** receive updates and training materials via e-mail.

Try indexing a test batch of the 1940 US Census to help you better prepare for the launch of the actual census on April 2. Because the *SIMULATION* 1940 US Census batches are for demonstration and training purposes only, arbitrators are asked to arbitrate them only as much as it takes to get comfortable and familiar with the project and its instructions.

Refer to the online <u>User Guide</u> (PDF format) to learn even more about the FamilySearch indexing software.

In "Unexpected Ways To Find Your Ancestors," Megan Smolenyak reminds us to:

- Learn to spell badly (e.g. person's given, middle, surname)
- Don't assume
- Swab, spit or swish (i.e. participate in DNA testing)
- Sweat the small stuff
- Step away from the computer (i.e. you still need to travel to find clues)
- Map it out
- Question what you "know"


