Public Invited. Join us at 6:30pm for coffee and socializing.


We meet at the University Baptist Church in the Great Room, 2nd floor. (16106 Middlebrook Drive, Clear Lake City - <u>online map</u>)

Melvyn Douglass is currently working as a professional genealogist and serving as Executive Director for the Scottish Clan Council of Houston, and Treasurer for the Houston Highland Games Association. Through American Peerage, Melvyn continues to provide genealogy support for resolving complex heirship situations. He was elected a Fellow of the Society of Antiquaries of Scotland (FSA Scot) in 2002. Melvyn was born and raised in Hampden County, Massachusetts. He worked for NASA Johnson Space Flight Center (then called Manned Spacecraft Center) in Houston, Texas during the Apollo 7 through 15 missions. The last six years, Melvyn has served on the Houston Mayor's International Affairs and Development Council / Europe dedicated to the preservation, promotion, and continued growth of Houston's standing as a renowned international city.

Last Month's Program Recap

A BIG Thank You goes out to Lynne Brooke for flying out from Washington D.C. last month to present a program to BAGS members and visitors. Lynne is again working on the genealogical staff for the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution (NSDAR). She has proven over 30 DAR descendants! A large number of lineage societies exist today representing either a specific time period, military event, geographical location, ethnicity, religion, occupation, or special interest. In general, their missions are to educate, preserve history, and promote fellowship. Lynne discussed the appropriate classic records and acceptable substitute records to use when proving generation linkage on a lineage society application. She shared some hints and tips on preparing an acceptable DAR application. Lynne encouraged us to search the online DAR Descendants database which includes more than 7.1 million names found on the lineage page of accepted DAR applications and supplementals. The search results provide names of relatives that are already DAR members and the common ancestry to a Revolution Patriot. For a fee, you can order a copy of an accepted application and see the lineage proof.

DAR GRC Index Resource


Since one of the NSDAR purposes is the collection and preservation of genealogical records,

DAR members have made a concerted effort to transcribe previously unpublished records of genealogical value to assist staff genealogists,

potential members, and the public. These typescripts contain a tremendous amount of unique genealogical material, much of it gleaned from gravestones, family Bibles, and personal collections. Members gather together information accessible to them where they live, through family connections, or in their own genealogical papers. The DAR Genealogical Records Committee (GRC) coordinates this nation-wide attempt to save historical records. Each year, US states send one or more volumes of reports containing typescripts collected from their DAR Chapters to the GRC Office. An online searchable national index is available on the DAR Genealogical Research System website representing over 57 million names

found on these typescripts from the 50 US states, District of Columbia, and Mexico. The index entries provide the GRC Report series number, volume number, and page number you would need to order a copy of the typescript (for a fee) through the DAR Library's Search Service. When ordering copies, attach a printout of the entire index entry(s) to provide all the details to the DAR research staff.

To find the GRC Report Index, access the DAR website, www.dar.org, click on the menu DAR Library and choose Online Research. This will access the DAR Genealogical Research System page. Click on the GRC tab to access the GRC Report Index search interface (or click here to go



From the search results, I was surprised to find entries pointing to a marriage application, family bible, Dallas newspaper, county cemetery, will, voter registration, and land survey. Click on a page number to view all names that appear on that page.

Atomic Training: Free on-demand software training

Interested in learning how to Skype or improve your Facebook skills? Want to know how to do a specific operation in Microsoft Word or Excel? Got an iPad and do not know how to use it? Need help understanding the new Windows and Mac operating systems? Atomic Training offers free, online, self-paced video training on a variety of Microsoft, Adobe, Apple, Google, and social networking products. Look under the "More" category to find training on Firefox, Open Office, and Social Networking (which includes Facebook, flickr, Pinterest, Skype, Twitter, and WordPress).

Atomic Training is available through the Friendswood Public Library using your library card. Anyone can get a free library card regardless of where they live. The application must be submitted in person with a valid photo I.D. and current address (or bring a piece of mail with current address).

To utilize Atomic Training resources, you will need a web browser (either Internet Explorer version 8 or higher, or Firefox 3.6 or higher, Google Chrome, or Safari 5 or higher) with 3rd party cookies enabled, and either Adobe Flash or QuickTime plugin installed. For best results on the iPad, choose QuickTime as your player preference and turn off closed captioning.

To access Atomic Training, go to **www.friendswood.lib.tx.us** and click on the icon.



As a new user press the "Create Account" button, enter your Friendswood Public Library card number (all 14 digits, do not enter the spaces) and press the "Validate" button. Enter a valid email and a password, and then click on the "Create Account" button. You will be sent a confirming email, that you must open and click on the embedded link to confirm your new account which will guide you through logging in the first time.

Once log in is successful, click the link shown below the "confirmed" message to access the

library's subscription.

The right and left hand sections of the next screen can be expanded or collapsed by clicking on the "+" or arrow buttons. Click on the topic you want to learn
