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Dedication of a Texas Historic Cemetery Marker

The Brewer Cemetery Texas Historic Cemetery Marker was dedicated on June 22, 2013 by the Nacogdoches County Historical Commission and the Brewer Cemetery Association in conjunction with the 2013 Brewer Family Reunion held in Nacogdoches, TX. Dr. Tom Middlebrook,

Chairman, Nacogdoches County Historical Commission, conducted the ceremony with the assistance of speakers from the Brewer Cemetery Association. In addition to Brewer family members from Texas, California, Oklahoma and Arkansas, members of the Nacogdoches Historical



Commission, Daughters of the Republic of Texas, local historian Carolyn Ericson and others attended this special ceremony.





The Brewer Cemetery was designated a Texas Historic Cemetery in 2010. It is located on a league of land (4,000 acres) granted to Henry Brewer by the Mexican government in 1834. The cemetery

dates from around 1816 and contains not only the graves of Henry Brewer and his family members, but those of collateral





families such as the Parker, Gage, Wade, Brooks and Whitaker families. A ground radar penetration survey by the US Forest Service identified at least 50 unmarked graves.

The Texas Centennial Commission erected a monument to Henry and Susannah Mitchell

Brewer and their sons Henry Mitchell Brewer and

John Brewer in 1936 in recognition of their service to Texas. Henry Brewer and his son John fought in the Battle of Nacogdoches and Henry Mitchell Brewer fought at the Battle of San Jacinto. Alexander McKinza and Thomas D. Brooks (sons-in-law of Henry Brewer) also fought at the Battle of San Jacinto.



June Program Recap

Lynna Kay Shuffield provided an educational and entertaining program on tips and tricks for researching and preserving cemeteries. She encouraged everyone to be a cemetery preservationist. Registering a cemetery with the Texas Historical Commission (THC) can be done by anyone, meaning you do **not** have to be a relative of someone buried in the cemetery. The process generates a survey of the cemetery's existing condition which will help future generations. More importantly, the cemetery boundaries are recorded in the county deed records to alert its existence to present and future owners of adjacent lands. Cemetery preservation information, cemetery laws, Historic Texas Cemetery Designation process, RIP (Record, Investigate, and Protect) Guardian Network, and access to the online Texas Historical Sites Atlas (THSA) are available on the THC's website at www.thc.state.tx.us/preserve/projectsand-programs/cemetery-preservation. Look to see if a local cemetery is already designated as a historic site using the online **THSA**. On the left side of the webpage, choose a county and check only the box next to cemetery and press search. The left side will update with a list of all the historic cemeteries in that county with links to its location and a brief description.

Saturday, July 27 from 10:30am to 4:15pm These programs are free and open to the public.

GATA GACC! DNA and Genetic Genealogy

Today From 10:30am to noon, listen to a general introduction to using DNA testing for genealogy and where we are today. nIt introduces Y-DNA for the direct paternal line, mitochondrial DNA for the direct maternal line, and autosomal DNA for the other ancestral lines. You will learn what DNA testing is and how to obtain the tests, how to use the test results to maximize the contribution to genealogical research goals, and which tests can be used for ethnic studies based on the current technology.

Going Nuclear: DNA Discoveries to Trace All Lines of Descent From 1:30pm to 2:15pm, learn to link families using autosomal DNA test results from any testing company. Maximize impact on your genealogical research goals. Includes how to use test results such as those from 23andMe, AncestryDNA, and Family Tree DNA autosomal tests.

Paternal Lines: Using Y-DNA From 2:30pm to 3:15pm, learn details of Y-DNA testing including how to analyze test results. Findings can corroborate your paper trail or place you on the right research path.

Two American frontier collections are available at Clayton Library, Mr. Draper and Rev Shane, each with a different focus that should be researched by almost every family researcher. The geographical areas of the collections include the western Carolinas and Virginia, some portions of Georgia and Alabama, the entire Ohio River Valley, and the Mississippi River Valley. Their two collections complement one another and bring to the researcher a vast amount of original material, including vital records, maps, petitions, and lists that never became part of the "official record."
