# Friday, January 29, 2016: Modern Military Research: How To Find Your 20th Century Military Relative

Public Invited. Join us at 6:30pm for socializing.

We meet at the University Baptist Church (UBC) in the Chapel, 1<sup>st</sup> floor. (16106 Middlebrook Drive, Houston, TX 77059 - online map).

In this program, Irene Walters will discuss records of military service of men and women from the Spanish-American War through today. Particular emphasis is paid to the two World Wars.

Irene Walters is one of the "Yankee Librarians" at Houston's Clayton Library Center for Genealogical Research. She is originally from New York State and has her Masters of Library Science degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo. Irene is the liaison between Clayton and the Houston Public Library cataloging department. She also coordinates Clayton's involvement in the digitization project with the LDS Library in Salt Lake City. Irene has given talks to many local groups on various aspects of genealogical research including, computers, the Internet, ancestors in the modern military, using newspapers for your research, New York State, Irish and French research.



## **Ancestry to Retire Family Tree Maker Desktop Software**

Ancestry.com stopped selling Family Tree Maker on December 31, 2015. They will continue to support existing Family Tree Maker owners at least through January 1, 2017. Before 2017, all features of the software, including TreeSync<sup>TM</sup> will continue to work. The Member Services team will also remain available to assist with questions or issues owners have. Presently there are no plans to sell Family Tree Maker software to another company.

- After January 1, 2017, features that require connectivity to *Ancestry.com* may no longer be support such as TreeSync<sup>TM</sup>, uploading and downloading trees and media, and Web Search.
- Most Family Tree Maker features are designed to work without an Internet connection to Ancestry.com. So you can continue to access your family data stored on your computer through Family Tree Maker desktop software beyond Jan. 1, 2017.
