# Annual Writing and Website Awards Deadline September 15

During 2015 and 2016, have you published your family history or the history of a county or community? Or compiled and published collections of transcribed local records of genealogical value such as cemetery, newspaper, census, or courthouse? If yes, consider submitting your work to compete for an award.

Texas State Genealogical Society (TxSGS) offers cash prizes for the following awards to partner societies and individual members who have paid their dues for the full year 2016. The Bay Area Genealogical Society is a partner society of TxSGS. To participate in individual writing awards, you need to join TxSGS. A personal membership is \$25 per year. Membership may be applied retroactively. First through third place cash awards will be presented during the Awards Banquet at the TxSGS Annual Conference on Saturday, October 29, 2016 in Dallas, TX. BAGS member Melodey Hauch has won several TxSGS writing awards for her self-published books and as editor of the BAGS Quarterly.

#### Writing Awards - book, manuscript, column, periodical

All books entered in the competition will be donated to the Texas State Library & Archives Genealogy collection in Austin, or, if that library has a copy, then to another library whose collection is open to the public. In addition to the awards in each category, a grand prize will be awarded to the best overall entry in the book competition, regardless of the category. The grand prize award is \$400.
