Research Resources

The U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) collected and created a number of rolls identifying Native Americans as a result of allotments, legislation, removals, treaties, and other activities. The National Archives BIA page explains the variety of records (allotments, applications, case files, rolls, schools, etc.) available and where they can be found. **www.archives.gov/research/native-americans/bia** A separate National
