Friday, October 27, 2017: "Reading Between the Lines, an in depth look at UK census records" presented by David Talbot Gardiner

David Gardiner's program centers on the United Kingdom census's 1800 - 2011, their scope and shortcomings. He will share insights on what information can be found in the records, what information can be accessed online, and the hidden clues that can be found therein if you look closely.



Butler Ranch Black Cowboys on the Chisholm Trail

They were Butler family slaves who became Butler employees and later pioneer settlers of the 1867 Settlement in Texas City. One has a connection to the Butler live oaks along Main Street.
