Get Help using the FamilySearch Wiki www.familysearch.org/wiki/en/England_Genealogy These pages provide lists of online resources (free and pay), details on specific parish research, and lists free online lessons available for researching this geographical area.

On <u>www.FamilySearch.org</u> you can find 1841, 1851, 1861, 1871, 1881, 1891, 1901, 1911 indexes and transcriptions. Images may be viewed when inside a Family History Center or if you have a subscription to FindMyPast.com. To View what resources United Kingdom resources are available in FamilySearch:

- 1. Click Search and on that screen click "Browse all published collections"
- 2. Narrow the listing by selecting location United Kingdom on the left side.
- 3. Narrow the listing more by selecting the type of collection (e.g. Census Lists) on the left side.

On <u>www.Ancestry.com</u> you can find the same censuses with indexes, transcriptions, and images. Read the details provided at the bottom of the search page for each year to learn details on what information and parishes are included. To View what resources United Kingdom resources are available in Ancestry.com

- 1. Click Search then click Card Catalog
- 2. Narrow the listing by typing United Kingdom in the keyword(s) box
- 3. On the left side, scroll down to Collection section and click on Census
