

#### Swabbed and Found January Program Recap

Frank Billingsley, Chief
Meteorologist at KPRC Channel 2 in
Houston, gave a very engaging talk
about his research to discover his
birth parents and make contact with
them. He was adopted at the age of
4 months. His book *Swabbed and*Found explains the research steps
and connections he made along the
way. DNA testing with several

companies helped make his first family connection. He encourages adoptees to stick with the research but cautions when you do get a conclusion, it may or may not be a good conclusion. Check out his book from a local library or purchase it from Amazon.com. We had a wonderful attendence for this meeting, 61 members and 65 visitors!

#### Researching Tips for American Revolutionary War Service

BAGS member Liz Strassner is also a member of the local Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) Captain Gilbreth Falls-Absolom Hooper Chapter. She shared the following tips for those researching ancestors that provided service to the American Revolution War effort.

- American Revolutionary War Pensions were only for those who served long periods of time for Continental Line, rather than state militias, and lived long enough to collect.
- Militia duty could last just a few days or a couple of months. Look in different places for their service, mostly state held muster rolls.
- For someone who was not in the military, look for jury duty, public office, surveyor, "Committee of Safety" or something similar (code for rebellion), supply tax, paid for replacement in military.
- Debbie Duay and her husband Ted created a website *Debbie Duay's Lineage Research Corner* which provides a list of resources (including links) on the "Sources of Service" page (www.learnwebskills.com/lineage/hidden2.htm) that could be used to prove service to the American Revolution War effort. The list is broken up by State/Territory and at the bottom are resources for French Patriots and French Canadian Patriots. Some of these resources are part of *Ancestry.com*, *Fold3.com*, and *FamilySearch.org*.

Amanda Pearson, BAGS Member Services chair, is a member of the same DAR chapter and works with Liz and others to research lineage applications. Amanda has had four patriots approved! Some of her research has lead to inter-library loaned books containing colonial and Revolutionary families, and specific state/county public land claims. Her lastest proven patriot was John Ward, a private. According to his pension he joined up in North Carolina. After his enlistment time was up, he moved to South Carolina and joined up again. When he was an old man, he moved to Alabama with most of his adult children and that is where he died.
