#### What does the George Memorial Library Genealogical and Local History Department have to offer?

Their genealogy department's resources focus on the southeastern United States and include materials relating to the history of the South, federal censuses, genealogy, and the Civil War. Specifically,

- Immigration records (published passenger lists from Mayflower to Galveston)
- General Index to Compiled Service Records for the Revolutionary War
- American Revolution War Pension and Bounty Land Warrant Application files
- Index to Compiled Service Records of Volunteer Soldiers Who Served During the Mexican War
- Index to Confederate Soldiers
- Texas Confederate Compiled Service Records and Union soldiers who served in organizations from the State of Texas.
- Prisoners of War Registers of Confederates in Civil War and Americans held in Montreal and Quebec during War of 1812
- DAR lineage books and indexes
- Newspapers (Fort Bend County only, starting with 1911; Brookshire Times 1899-1984; Galveston Daily News 1865-1917; and Telegraph & Texas Register, Houston, Texas 1835-1875)
- Local histories (county, state, and city & town histories for southeastern U.S.). They have research material for each county in Texas. Non-current government records and indexes for Austin, Brazoria, Fort Bend, Matagorda, Waller and Wharton counties
- German immigration in Texas and Special collection of the Czech Heritage Society of Texas
- Fort Bend County photo collection
- Fort Bend County vertical files (biographies, cemeteries, churches, history, and obituaries)
- Access to *Ancestry.com* within the library.

### Navigating your FamilyTreeDNA test results

Login into your FamilyTreeDNA.com and you will see the "dashboard".

Family Finder @ Results On the dashboard, look for a box "Family Finder" section and click on "Matches" button. This will list all the people that have had their DNA (Autosomal DNA) tested and they match you!

By default, the match list is sorted by "Shared Centimorgans" amount, from most to least. The larger the value, the closer the relationship. Click on a column heading to sort list by ascending or descending values in that column. You can also filter the results list by 1) relationship category (pull down menu) 2) use "in common with" or "not in common with" 2) Tabs (all, maternal, paternal) which only are enabled after you have created a family tree and established the DNA relationship to one paternal and one maternal relative. You can also search the match list by surname. The advanced search gives you the additional filtering combinations.

The information shown for each individual match includes the name of the person whose DNA was tested, date when the match appears (entered), an estimated relationship range, shared centimorgans value (cM), longest amount of DNA involved in the match, X-Match indicator which when present indicates this relationship stems from the female side, the linked relationship based off joining DNA matches to your family tree, ancestral surnames as provided by the tested person in their profile. There are icons for sending an email (to their personal email outside of FamilyTreeDNA website), adding a note(s), accessing family tree (pedigree chart is blue if there is one, click to access), and established maternal or paternal relationship.

In this example, Chester's DNA test showed a match with Kate Schondelmeyer and V. Dver. The amount of DNA that matched (cM value of 276) estimates their relationship to be 1st to 3rd cousin. Kate did not provide a family tree. In this case, click on the email icon to correspond and share information. Blaine Bettinger, Ph.D., J.D. developed a chart to help identify family relationship possibilities based on cM ranges. Bettinger continues to refine the cM relationship numbers. His latest chart is available online at his Genetic Genealogist blog posting August 26, 2017, accessible online at https://thegeneticgenealogist.com/2017/08/26/august-2017-update-to-the-shared-cm-project

Since V. Dyer uploaded a family tree into FTDNA (blue pedigree icon). Chester was able to view the family members and determine their common ancestor was Chester's paternal great grandfather, establishing their relationship as 2nd cousin one removed.

If there is a "X-Match" in the "X-Match" column, this narrows the relationship possibilities. Use the appropriate X chromosome inheritance fan chart to consider which of the possible ancestors could be the common ancestor. ### Eliminate requirement for paper ballot per bylaws

#### Current Article IX, Section D from 29 April 2011 Bylaws:

D. Voting and Eligibility:

- 1. Only members in good standing will be eligible to vote.
- 2. Voting shall be by paper ballot, and the nominee receiving the majority of the votes shall be elected. A quorum is required.

### Proposed Article IX, Section D:

- D. Voting and Eligibility:
  - 1. Only members in good standing will be eligible to vote.
  - 2. If any positions on the ballot are contested, the voting for such positions shall be by paper ballot, and the nominee receiving the majority of the votes for such positions shall be elected. A quorum is required.
  - 3. For any positions on the ballot that are uncontested, and for which there are no nominations from the floor, the presiding officer can declare the nominees for such positions elected by "acclimation." A quorum is required.

### Align the months for removal from membership and inclusion in yearbook

### Current Article IV, Section C from 26 Feb 2016 bylaws:

C. Dues and Fiscal Year:

4. To be included in the Yearbook, annual dues must be paid by the September General Meeting. Any member who has not renewed by December 31 shall be removed from the membership roll.

### Proposed Article IV, Section C:

C. Dues and Fiscal Year:

4. Any member who has not renewed by December 31 shall be removed from the membership roll and not included in the Yearbook.


