

November Program Recap – The Cuban Papers

The Cuban Papers are the "Americas" Spanish government papers dating back to 1570's and maintained in Havana, Cuba before they were archived in Spain. The Clayton Library Center for Genealogical Research has a portion of this collection on microfilm that focuses on the Gulf Coast between 1703 and 1823. Anglo surnames and freed slaves appear in the content which includes militia, settlers, immigrants, legal proceedings, indian treaties, tax lists, and censuses. Anthony Startz stressed American Revolutionary support came from men living on this Spanish land. She has dug into this resource and published her translations to support the Daughters of the American Revolution work. Several researchers have explored the microfilm rolls and developed indexes to help the rest of us access specific material. Look for your surnames and locations using one of these resources:
