Recap November 2019 Program – DNA Painter



BAGS member, Gale French, presented the program 'Using DNA Painter for Chromosome Mapping". Gale is retired from IBM where he worked in the US Space program at NASA's Johnson Space Center. Currently, he teaches online classes through DNAAdoption.org and volunteers with DNA Detectives in assisting adoptees to locate their biological family. Gale has presented programs at a number of Societies and conferences including RootsTech and Texas State Genealogical Conference.

DNA Painter is a website (www.dnapainter.com) that offers free and subscription tools to dig deeper into your Autosomal DNA test results. This site is not for analyzing YDNA or mtDNA test results.

Have you tried using "The Shared cM Project" relationship chart published by Blaine T. Bettinger to decipher your list of matches? Well, DNA Painter has automated that process using their Shared cM Tool (https://dnapainter.com/tools/sharedcmv4). Just enter the centiMorgans amount value (cM) that you share with a match at the top of the page. Then look at the bottom of the page to see an updated Bettinger's "Shared cM Project" relationship chart indicating graphically the only possible relationships to consider between you and your DNA matching relative. Plus DNA Painter

provides a list of relationship probabilities to get you started

down a path.

Chromosome Mapping tool allows you to graphically show the ancestral inheritance of individual pieces of your individual chromosomes using your known relationship DNA matches. Then use this map to identify the ancestral relationship of a new DNA match when a tree or other clues are NOT provided. To understand how to start and use a Chromosome Mapping, there is an online free video you can watch "An Introduction to DNA Painter" hosted by FamilyTree Webinars. DNA Painter offers other tools 1) chromosome cluster painter/formatter, 2) What Are The Odds (WATO) tracker, and 3) tree tool to import GEDCOM file and generate pedigree and fan charts that can be linked to DNA information.
