Bylaws – Proposed Changes

The following proposed changes to the BAGS Bylaws will be presented to the membership at the June 2020 meeting. During the July 2020 general meeting, these changes will be presented again to the membership, along with a chance for discussion and a vote. The complete bylaws are printed at the end of each BAGS *Yearbook*. A copy of the **Bylaws** and the *2019-2020 Yearbook* (current issue) are available on the BAGS website **www.TxBayAreaGen.org**, click on **Members Page**, enter password. Thank you to Bill Mayo, Kitty Olson, George Porterfield, Bill Mayo, and Lisa Smith for serving as the committee to review and update the bylaws.

Article IV – Membership and Dues

- A. Membership is open to any individual having genealogical interests without regard to sex, race, creed, or national origin. Members are encouraged to submit a Five-generation Pedigree Chart pedigree chart in a timely fashion.
- B. Categories of Membership:
 - 1. Individual Membership
 - Family Membership
 Related individuals; receives one copy of BAGS' publications
 - 3. (add) Lifetime (individual)
 - 4. (add) Lifetime Honorary

A non-voting individual membership approved by the Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") awarded to a person who has made an outstanding contribution to Bay Area Genealogical Society and/or to the field of genealogy.

- C. Categories of 3. Donations (made in addition to dues; applies to the current membership year):
 - 1. Contributor \$1 \$29
 - 2. Benefactor \$30 \$49
 - 3. Patron \$50 or more
- D. C. Dues and Fiscal Year:
- 1. Changes to dues for each category of membership shall be recommended by the Board and approved by a majority vote of the membership at a General Meeting, having been given one month's notice of the proposed change.
- 2. The Membership Year and the Fiscal Year shall run from September 1 through August 31.
- 3. New memberships are accepted by the Registrar upon completion of Membership Application and payment of dues.
- 4.— Any member who has not paid membership dues for the membership year by the end of that membership year, shall be removed from the membership roll as of the last day of the membership year. Any member who has not paid their dues by the last day of December will not be included in the BAGS Yearbook for the current fiscal year.
- 4. New memberships paid between July 1 and September 1 shall be for the upcoming membership year. All other new memberships will be for the current membership year.
- 5. The deadline for renewals is October 31 of the current membership year. Any member who has not renewed by October 31 shall be removed from the membership roster on November 1 and will not be included in the yearbook.
- E. D. Visitors may attend up to two General Meetings without joining the Society, after which a paid membership will be required to attend further meetings.




Consultations with a library specialist are held using Microsoft Teams (step-by-step instructions are also available on the wiki page). They request

you provide as much information as possible about the research problem on the bookings form. Limit to 1 consultation per week. Due to contractual obligations, FamilySearch cannot offer access in online consultations to historical records that are restricted to family history centers and affiliate libraries, despite the temporary closure of these facilities.



Galveston Tribune Newspaper


The Galveston and Texas History Center (www.galvestonhistorycenter.org) located in the Rosenberg Library has digitized the Galveston Tribune from 1885-1904 and it is now available in the Portal of Texas History for you to search and read for free. In the past, this newspaper was only available through microfilm and bound volumes and a limited set of issues were available online in Newspapers Archives. The Galveston Tribune was published six days a week until 1963, when it was combined with the Galveston Daily News. The Galveston Tribune ran more social news than the Galveston Daily News, often publishing obituaries that were not reported in other papers.
