Birds of a Feather—Y-DNA Research and Group Projects presented by Janine Cloud Friday, November 20 at 7:00 P. M. (one week earlier)

Y-chromosomal DNA passes only from father to son, but while the path of inheritance is simple, choosing which Y test to take can be confusing, and using the results once you have them

can be even more confusing. Group projects can help alleviate some of that confusion as well as help focus research through comparison with other testers beyond simple one-to-one matching. This program will be presented online, and access details will be posted on the BAGS website and emailed to members.

Janine Cloud, a fifth-generation Texan and registered member of the Cherokee Nation, became interested in genealogy when a grade school assignment to complete a pedigree chart prompted her to question family members about her ancestors. She started working at FamilyTreeDNA in 2011 where she created the Group Projects – Events team which she now manages. Janine has given presentations at conferences such as the National Genealogical Society Conference, RootsTech and RootsTech London, as well as numerous local organizations.



RECAP AND RESEARCH

NAVIGATING FREEDMEN'S BUREAU RECORDS - October Program Recap

Thank you, Sharon Batiste Gillins, for the impressive presentation on *Navigating Freedmen's Bureau Records—Strategies for Research Success* given to the Bay Area Genealogical Society members at the October general meeting. Sharon's topic provided insight into the records of the Freedmen's Bureau Records, digitized and indexed on FamilySearch.org, while also offering caution before just jumping into a search. As genealogists we have been told to gain an understanding of the record set first to capture and analyze intelligently the details extracted from within the document. Freedmen's Bureau Records were generated at various levels within each state and the information captured could vary. To understand the records better Sharon suggested multiple times to know what to expect by studying the state's Descriptive Pamphlet printed by the National Archives and Records Administration.

A partnership of the Georgetown Memory Project and American Ancestors, the oldest non-profit genealogical society in America, have created a website and digitized database paying tribute to those sold and their descendants named the GU272 Memory Project.
