The Road to Independence: Researching Your Revolutionary War Ancestors presented by Michael L. Strauss, AG, Genealogy Research Network

The Revolutionary War was fought in part over tensions between England and her colonies that escalated over time into violence with the opening shots fired in Massachusetts in April 1775. Some of the historical records examined will include compiled military service records, pensions, state and federal bounty land, local militia, along with records from the Continental Navy and Marine Corps. Additionally historical context include some of the national emergencies after the end of the war in 1783 including both Shay's Rebellion and the later Whiskey Rebellion.

Michael L. Strauss, AG, is a professional Accredited Genealogist and a nationally recognized speaker. A native of Pennsylvania and a resident of Utah, he has been employed as a Forensic Genealogist for more than 25 years. Strauss has a BA in History and is a United States Coast Guard veteran. He is a qualified expert witness in court in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. Strauss is a faculty member of IGHR (in Athens, GA), SLIG (in Salt Lake City, UT), and GRIP (in Pittsburgh, PA), and the Course Coordinator for the Military Course at IGHR. Michael has been involved in Civil War reenacting for more than 25 years.

HELP! I Don't Speak the Language: Tips and Tricks for Deciphering Foreign Language Records presented by Katherine Schrober



Katherine Schrober shared helpful hints when trying to read not only a foreign language but even early English and colonial handwriting. One tip was to thoroughly review the document looking for other words using similar letters found in the *difficult to read* word or phrase. Often subsequent uses of the letter are much more readable and when you go back to the original "unreadable word" it may make sense the second time around! As a German-English translator, she shared a long list of helpful websites for the genealogist

faced with foreign documents, such as the FamilySearch Wiki page for <u>Genealogical Word Lists.</u>

SCANNING OLD ALBUMS

Do you have old family albums where the pictures are glued to the pages? Well, I do. I discovered an App which makes scanning these pictures easy and functional. After you download **Photomyne** to your iPhone or Android phone, you can use it to take pictures of album pages. **Photomyne** straightens the photos and enhances them. Then you can view the whole page, but even better, it allows you to pull up the individual pictures.

Here is an example. The first picture is one I took of the album page with my regular iPhone camera. The pictures were glued to the black page and trying to remove them would have damaged them.


The pictures below were from the same album page but taken with **Photomyne**.











Photomyne edits and straightens the pictures and, best of all, you can bring up one image at a time from the group. Now your old album is still intact and you have digitized images of the contents.

Photomyne offers a free account or upgraded subscription with additional features. Give the free version a try by downloading from either Apple Store or Google Play.

Each brick wall will be briefly presented by the submitter at the meeting. Then discussion will open for suggestions from the group. Participants will have the opportunity to offer suggestions to provide more avenues to research. Remember, the more you can tell us about what you know (and don't know) and where you have already researched, the more we can help you!

Brick walls must be submitted no later than one week prior to the **Brick Wall Busters SIG** meeting. BAGS members may submit only one brick wall per meeting. Monthly brick wall submissions will be posted to the BAGS website and Facebook page several days prior to each SIG meeting. An email will be distributed when the pre-read availability has opened. SIG participants are encouraged to read the submissions prior to meeting but do not need to research others' brick walls. The aim of the group is to offer comments and advice on next steps in research to possibly crumble that wall.

Submit your brick wall (no more than 2 pages) in PDF format to <u>emailcoord@txbayareagen.org</u>. Suggested items to include: a research question, timeline, family tree, locality, list of resources already consulted with short comment of results (positive or negative), or any information which is deemed important. Submissions can be in various forms: bullet points, outlines, paragraph summaries, as examples.


