MAY General Meeting recap...

Genealogy from a Private Investigator's Perspective presented by Lisa Smith, Dragon Investigation Group



Lisa Smith not only represents the membership of the Bay Area Genealogical Society as our president, but she is a private investigator and owner of Dragon Investigation Group. Her presentation paralleled the skills and approaches she applies to both genealogical research questions and her cases as an investigator. Lisa provided insight into the often asked questions regarding DNA

testing and privacy issues with regards to law enforcement investigations. Four investigative case studies taken on by Lisa, as a private investigator, and highlighted in the program, shared intriguing steps taken to resolve objectives.

Record As You Go, Cite As You Go, & File As You Go presented by Cyndi Ingle



Genealogists tend to get very excited about new records and sources they come across in their research. So much so that they grab a quick copy, download it to default folders, and move on to the next item without thoroughly exploring the source first. All too often they don't take the time to evaluate the source, to write the citation for the source, or to file it in the correct spot. We have to slow down and take the time to think, to file, and to create notes about the source that make it easy to find that source again if needed. Doing this keeps our research more organized, but also keeps our research brain tidy as well. We are much more productive when we can

easily put our hands on what we've found in the past. We will explore different options for accomplishing all of these important steps.

Cyndi Ingle is the creator and innovator behind the award-winning and globally recognized CyndisList.com, a free categorized list of more than 337,000 links for genealogical research. Cyndi has an expertise in using technology for genealogy. From Becky Jones...

Are you ready for the release of the 1950 U.S. Census on 1 April 2022?

After recently attending two virtual webinars highlighting the 1950 U.S. Census release, Becky is sharing some tips and websites in this month's and upcoming editions to help you prepare for the big day.

It is expected at this time major genealogy websites (Ancestry, FamilySearch, MyHeritage, etc.) will start their processes to have images of the census available to their subscribers soon after the release date, similar to that of the 1940 census release in 2012. Estimates of up to six months of volunteer efforts are expected before the census images will be indexed for efficient researching. Until that time take a look at a blank 1950 census document to learn the questions that were asked of the population. Acquaint yourself with the enumerator instructions here.

1950 was the first year provisions were made to count members of the armed forces, crews of vessels, and employees of the United States government living in foreign countries, along with members of their families also abroad. *Watch for more tips in the July and August editions of the newsletter.*


