Law Enforcement Use of Genetic Genealogy by Shera LaPoint

General Membership meeting followed by a LIVE virtual presentation.

Originally from Kaplan, LA. Shera Broussard LaPoint is married to Dr. Paul LaPoint Sr., proud mother of 4 children and grandmother of 8. She accidentally became a genealogy and DNA enthusiast after joining Ancestry following her grandfather's death in 2003. Her passion for genealogy grew in 2015 when she submitted an Ancestry DNA test. Shera is active on social media with her Facebook group, "Our Roots Genealogy & DNA Network." She is a professional genealogist (The Gene Hunter, LLC) and a popular genealogical and DNA lecturer. Shera focuses on helping adoptees and people of unknown parentage find their families. Shera's completed over 80 such adoptee cases after many families spent lifetimes trying to figure them out. Inspired and substantiated by the recent success of an unsolved cold case, "The Killing Fields," she was able to assist Texas authorities in identifying two victims in decades-old "Killing Fields" murders using genetic genealogy. LaPoint learned that as a genetic genealogist, you could take genealogy techniques to the next level. Shera is currently consulting on three active unidentified person cases, has attended the Harris County Topics in Forensic Sciences Conference, and has completed Excelsior College's online Genetic Genealogy curriculum. She was recently awarded the League City Texas Police Departments Chief's Coin of Excellence for Outstanding Performance for her genealogical assistance to Detective Recie Tisdale in the Donna Gonsoulin Prudhomme case. On Friday, September 30th, Gale French delivered an outstanding Zoom introduction to *Using Google Earth in Genealogy*. His presentation revealed many exciting features in Google Earth and demonstrated how its capabilities can be used in telling genealogy stories. Gale showed the audience how to add features like photos, maps and documents to Google Earth, by location, and tie them together to create a remarkable family history "tour." Google Earth is an effective tool that explains how to visualize your ancestor's history through locations and time.

Mr. French has been interested in genealogy for more than 25 years. He's lived in Texas his entire life and worked for IBM in the Space program at NASA's Johnson Space Center for 26 years. His work on imaging and document management enhances his genealogy organization and presentations. He has received several IBM, NASA, and genealogy awards.


RETURN of the Bus Trips to Clayton Library!!




