

Getting to Know The ACPL Genealogy Center and PERSI – Periodical Sources Index

with Allison Singleton

The Allen County Public Library Genealogy Center is the second largest genealogy library in the country with a vast amount of research materials in both physical and digital form. One of the ACPL's gems is the Periodical Source Index (PERSI) which will be covered in this presentation. We will discover how we can use this wonderful resource!

Allison DePrey Singleton, MA, MLS, is a senior librarian in the Allen County Public Library Genealogy Center in Fort Wayne, IN. She provides research consultations, serves on the Center's programming team, and leads its family history webinars and educational initiatives. Allison was Co-Chair of the 2018 Federation of Genealogical Societies Conference and also a Northeast Regional CoCoordinator for the National History Day in Indiana. Besides her employment activities, Allison is also on the board of the Indiana Genealogical Society and Indiana German Heritage Society.

Allison began her genealogy research at the age of sixteen at the ACPL Genealogy Center. Since then she has been focused on the study of genealogy and archives. She traced her ancestors' paths to Indiana from Ohio, Kentucky, Virginia, France, Germany, England, and beyond. While Allison's specialties include researching in the regions of Indiana, France, and Germany and fields of social media, the Federal Census, teaching beginners, and genealogy programming, she loves learning new areas of genealogy. She views genealogy as lifelong education and continues to strive to learn more while keeping up with ever changing technology.



#### March 25, 2:00pm

<u>Using Timelines to Focus Your Research</u> by Susan Ball, followed by a group discussion on the topic. (a Texas State Genealogical Society video presentation—hybrid)



The most important tool you can use to research your ancestor is a timeline. Learn how to construct a timeline for your ancestor and use it to uncover previously overlooked avenues for research.

A genealogist for over 30 years, Susan Ball is **TxSGS** president, co-editor of *Stirpes*, and president of the San Angelo Genealogical & Historical Society. A strong supporter of records abstraction and publication, Susan has compiled four books of genealogical records, three of which have won TxSGS book awards including the coveted grand prize. She also serves her local society as editor of the SAG&HS Newsletter and assistant editor of *Stalkin' Kin of Old West Texas*, the SAG&HS biannual journal.

#### April 22, 9:00am - 4:30pm, BAGS Members ONLY (All day event, lunch on your own)

Research Like a Pro, by Diane Elder (hybrid presentation, 4 sessions)

Diana Elder, podcaster and author of the book, <u>Research Like a Pro: A Genealogists Guide</u> will show us how to make progress in our research by using her organized process. Diana will share her step-by-step method for the researcher ready to take their skills to the next level. She will teach us how to:

- 1. Form an objective for our project.
- 2. Review our research by creating a timeline analysis.



- . Construct a locality guide to direct our research.
- 4. Create a research plan to keep our researched focused.
- 5. Create style source citations for research credibility.
- Set up a research log to organize/track our searches.
- 7. Write a report detailing our findings for future research projects.

We will follow her case studies, showing how creating an objective, a timeline, and doing locality research laid the foundation for the research. Then see what results came from using a research log and completing the project with a research report.

Looking for Texas specific records? From the Panhandle to the Pecos, from Round Rock to the Rio Grande, TARO is your place to find rich Texas history. TARO (Texas Archival Resources Online) brings together historical documents, personal papers, family histories, and more from archives, libraries, and museums across Texas to inform, enrich, and



empower researchers all over the world to discover information for educational and professional purposes, as well as for personal enjoyment – helping users tell their story

TARO provides descriptions of abundant archival, manuscript, and museum collections in repositories across the state available to the public. The site consists of the collection descriptions or "finding aids" that archives, libraries, and museums create to assist users in locating information in their collections.

Browse the extended table of contents which describe unique materials only available at the select, individual repositories. In most cases, the collections themselves are NOT available online. Searches can be accomplished by Creator, Geographical Area, Subject or specific Repositories.

Check out the Maps for locations specific collections. Consider planning day trips or weekend genealogy get-aways to visit an incredible Texas Genealogical Library and their collection!
