Diana Crisman Smith: *It Takes A Village: Community Research*

Our ancestors didn't live as hermits in a cave for the most part. They were part of a community of some sort. It might have been a vibrant urban setting, a suburban area, a small town, a farm community, or a frontier area (even there they found a few neighbors). Finding records for all of them is a start, but don't you want to know more about HOW they lived and WHO their associates were? Let's talk about that community and what you can learn from others there. <u>*Register here*</u>

Our guest speaker, **Diana Smith**, has been researching her ancestry since age 10, speaking since 1980, and writing, teaching, and researching for clients since the late 1980s. She and her husband enjoyed serving as lay librarians at the Westlake, Ohio, FamilySearch Center for over 20 years. Diana has enjoyed speaking live and virtually at conferences around the country and at sea since the 1980s, always looking for new audiences and topics. In addition to genealogy cruises, Diana has spoken to large and small audiences around the United States. Virtual presentations have offered welcome new opportunities.

Diana has written for numerous genealogical publications, including NGS News Magazine, the APG Quarterly, and the Digital Genealogist Magazine. Diana also wrote <u>Finding Your Danish Ancestors: A Primer</u> for Research & History, *Chapter 4: "Scandinavia"* of <u>The Family Tree</u> <u>Guidebook to Europe: Your Essential Guide to Trace Your Genealogy</u> in Europe (2013), and transcriptions of *Green County* and *Shelby County Iowa Cemetery Records* from Cemetery Readings copied by Graves Registration WPA Project. Family Tree Makers MHM Group



Diana is a past board member of the Association of Professional Genealogists, the Florida State Genealogical Society, the Genealogical Speakers Guild, and the International Society

of Family History Writers and Editors. Since concluding a career in software consulting, she has sought new opportunities to learn including GRIP 2020: Law School for Genealogists, Hands-On Forensic Genealogy, and Land and Property Records







Judy Russell, the Legal Genealogist, presented <u>Copyright Mythconceptions</u> for our June Members' Meeting. Judy demonstrated that what we don't know about copyright law can hurt us – right

in the pocketbook! She guided us through the most common mistakes and misunderstandings about copyright law, including what we can and can't do with materials created by others in our family research.

Russell is a professional genealogist with a law degree who teaches and lectures on various genealogical topics, ranging from using court records in family history to understanding DNA testing. She is a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists, the National Genealogical Society, and numerous state and regional genealogical societies. She's written for the National Genealogical Society Quarterly (from which she received the 2017 Award of Excellence), the National Genealogical Society Magazine, the FGS Forum, the Board of Certified Genealogist's OnBoard, and Family Tree Magazine, among other publications. Her award-winning blog appears on The Legal Genealogist website.
