- Sends reminders to attendees.
- Maintains policy agreement and emergency forms for all attendees.







NEW FAMILYSEARCH FEATURES

During RootsTech 2024, FamilySearch announced a new feature called full-text searching. This feature is still experimental, but genealogists are blown away by its possibilities. To access Full-Text Searching, you MUST be logged into FamilySearch.

Let's go through the step-by-step process to use this tool:

- 1. Go to www.familysearch.org/labs
 - FamilySearch Labs



- 2. Sign into FamilySearch
- 3. Inside the box that says, "Expand your search with Full Text" click "TRY IT" or "Go To Experiment." This will open a new screen tab.
- 4. You will then see FamilySearch's disclaimer. This is an experimental product, so they don't guarantee it will always be available. Also, there is no support available for this product.
- 5. Now, you will enter your search terms. FamilySearch has a box with Search Tips that can help you find items of interest.

Why are genealogists so excited by this? Artificial Intelligence (AI) has transcribed over 100 million searchable records from the following collections: U.S. Land & Probate records, Freedman's Bureau records, Mexican notarial records, and the Ante-Bellum Southern Plantations Collection. This is just the beginning. FamilySearch intends to use AI to transcribe ALL unindexed records in their collection.

Here are a few general tips:

- Use creative searching. If you have a common name, be more specific about what you want to find.
- Search for "James Williams of Coleman" or "Williams of Coleman" to find records
- related to the Williams family that are in Coleman County.
- Use wildcards * (one or more characters) and ? (one character).
- Use the exact search "James Williams."
- Use + to link keywords together.
- Filtering is KEY! You can filter by year, type, place, or collection. Click on a filter and then choose from the choices provided. (Example: Click on "Record Place" and then select "United States of America." You can then filter by state and county.)
 - Remember that your ancestors may be in places you don't expect.

Tips for Using Keywords: A DE E

- $\sqrt{}$ Use multiple surnames
- Use names of geographical features
- Use both spouses' names
- Use occupations (ex., cooper, doctor)
- Use boundary descriptions to locate deeds $\sqrt{}$
- Use nicknames, middle names & reverse order of name (ex. McElrath James) $\sqrt{}$
- Use locations associated with your family other than the location being filtered
- Search using members of the FAN club (Friends, Associates & Neighbors)
- Phrase searches in quotes will return exact or similar results (Ex. Hellen will find Helen, "James W Williams" will also find similar results like "James Williams."

Unfortunately, there is no guide to show us exactly how this works – likely because it's still a work in progress. Right now, there isn't any advantage to using the surname box instead of or in conjunction with the keyword box, but this may change.

A few limitations you need to be aware of:

- There isn't a list of exactly what collections or items are included.
- Full-text searching is new and NOT perfect.
- Documents may have multiple dates listed (If the date listed occurs much later than an individual lived, don't discount it. It may still apply to that person - sometimes it takes decades for records to process through the courts.)
- Not everything will be transcribed correctly.
- If it's not digitized, it's not available yet.
 - Viewing restrictions still apply. This last limitation needs to be clarified: if you are searching land records of Dale County., Alabama, you won't find much of interest because although those records have been digitized, they're not available from home, so you will only be able to **view them at a FamilySearch Center**.

What I have discovered in about 10 hours of searching:

- \Rightarrow A land record naming the parents of Willie McElrath (the only previous proof was her death record), her siblings' names, and the dates of her parents' deaths.
- ⇒ A land record detailing purchased land in Jefferson County, Missouri, for D.C. Freeman after he "disappeared" from St. Louis, Missouri, in 1875.
- \Rightarrow A land record naming all the children (including those who were deceased) and the two wives of James Stephens of Coleman County.

If you need help using this new feature, join us for any Monday's MHM sessions!

Because this feature is being updated regularly, the examples may be outdated by the time it's published!
