Colonial Origins and DNA

with Kate Penny Howard

BAGS welcomes **Kate Penny Howard** presenting "Colonial Origins & DNA." Have you ever scrolled down your DNA match list past known family, to second, third, and fourth cousins, finding yourself in a harsh landscape of distant cousins? Kate will discuss when distant matches can be useful in confirming Colonial ancestors, and when they can be misleading. Kate will also explain how she broke through a brick wall using distant DNA matches.

Kate Penney Howard is a genetic genealogist and speaker specializing in endogamy and breaking down challenging research barriers with DNA. She brings decades of experience in family research and hundreds of successfully solved genetic genealogy cases. Known for her compassionate approach, Kate helps researchers uncover ancestral mysteries while providing more complete family medical histories and a stronger sense of identity. Her presentations captivate audiences by seamlessly blending historical context, technical guidance, and well-placed humor that keeps listeners engaged.

Kate discovered her passion for teaching during her cancer journey, finding fulfillment in sharing knowledge with fellow genealogists. She approaches her work with integrity, deliberately addressing historical injustices and dispelling common myths in her presentations. Kate has presented at RootsTech, East Coast Genetic Genealogy Conference, the International Congress on Medieval Studies, and Untangling Our Roots.


Join Us for the Annual SHOW & TELL Event - Celebrate Your Ancestors' Legacy!
