## **Lost in Ohio?** by Kathleen Williams

Clayton Library features a great resource titled **Ohio Wills and Estates to 1850:** An Index, by Carol Willsey Bell (Call number: B433 OHIO). This publication provides an extensive index to probate records from Ohio before 1850. While the book may appear unremarkable as it is solely an index, it can be instrumental in overcoming genealogical research obstacles pertaining to Ohio.

My Hoopingarner ancestors resided in Ohio during the early nineteenth century. After thoroughly reviewing all possible spellings, I located a single pertinent entry:

## Hoopingarner, John W1835 TU wb1234 p69; ad p105,152

According to the abbreviations list on page vii, this entry refers to a will from 1835 in Tuscarawas County. The first citation is for will book 1234, page 69; the second references administration dockets on pages 105 and 152.

Having identified these citations, my next step was to consult the original records. By searching Tuscarawas County, Ohio in the FamilySearch Wiki, I located additional information about available probate records. Both **Ancestry** and **FamilySearch** contain relevant probate documents for this county, with some accessible via Full-Text Search.


## <u>Family Tree Maker</u> – by Appointment Only


